The Final Whistle Bend Master Plan Concept which included the perimeter trail with out and away access for ATV and Snowmobile trail traffic was approved by Council Resolution on February 23, 2009.

Now that the Whistle Bend perimeter trail is constructed it is being brought forward for official 2007 Trail Plan designation through the Porter Creek, Whistle Bend, Takhini trail report process as recommended by the Whitehorse Trail and Greenways Committee on May 29, 2017.

#### **4. Why was the Whistle Bend trail designated multi-use?**

A Whistle Bend perimeter trail was intended to be Multi-Use to address feedback from stakeholders and participants who participated in the planning and development of the Whistle Bend Master Plan which was approved by Council resolution in 2009. Once built, the trail was adopted as Multi-Use until such time that a thorough assessment could be completed using the 2007 Trail Plan trail development strategy of a neighborhood trail task force group which was done in 2016 with a report prepared and presented to Mayor and Council for official trail designation on May 29, 2017



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### 5. What other trails are designated MMU in Whitehorse?

Attached is the current MMU trail map including all trails in the City of Whitehorse trail inventory. Many of these trails do not have an official name but are currently receiving an ID number to identify them on a map as part of the City's asset management project. Please note that there is an error on the current MMU map posted on the City's website in relation to the alignment of the Whistle Bend perimeter trail as the line on the map shows the trail running along Casca Blvd. which is incorrect and has been corrected and re-aligned using the City's GIS system and will be replaced on the City's website very soon.
