## 1. Please provide update on Marwell Lift Station project?

### Bypass Vault Construction

The construction of the bypass vault is progressing. The first major component was the installation of the piling coffer dam. The coffer dam is working well, allowing for the installation of the base and formwork. The concrete work for the base and walls is scheduled for this week.

### Marwell Lift Process Piping

The construction for the process piping is scheduled to commence this fall with final completion prior to August 2018. The contractor is Wildstone Construction. The Work includes:

- 1) Installing and operating a temporary full station bypass
- 2) Installing valves into the outlet pipe while in operation
- 3) Replacement of all internal piping
- 4) Replacement of 4 large internal isolation valves

- 5) Installation of a surge protection system
- 6) Installation of a permanent internal bypass system

## **2. When is the trail development policy coming to council?**

Administration continues to work with stakeholders, trail stewards and land owners to develop a new trail development policy. It is expected that the new policy will be brought forward to Council in a CASM sometime in late March 2018 following the upcoming neighborhood trail task force working group meetings for Whitehorse North and South. Both task forces will have an opportunity to review the draft policy and provide feedback as well administration will obtain feedback from KDFN and TKC prior to the policy coming to Council for review.

## **3. What will be the future trail application process without the WTGC?**

Administration will continue to consult with all trail stewards and land owners prior to approval of any individual trail applications prior to the new trail development policy being adopted by Council. Most of the proposed trails anticipated for 2018 will be included in the neighborhood trail task force reports (both of which include a comprehensive public consultation process) that will require Council approval prior to implementation. Those reports are anticipated to come forward to Council for approval in early spring 2018.
