



Letter of Notice

Spray Foam Installers, Architect, Designers, Engineers, the Construction Industry, Contractors, Suppliers providing services through-out Yukon and Building Owners

RE: Requirements for the Inspection of Spray Foam Installation

We are writing to alert you of the requirements in pertaining to the *Installation of Spray Foam Insulation*.

Spray Foam Material shall comply with CAN/ULC-S705.1, "Thermal Insulation – Spray Applied Rigid Polyurethane Foam, Medium Density – Material – Specification" and shall be *Installed* in conformance with CAN/ULC-S705-2, "Thermal Insulation – Spray-Applied Ridged Polyurethane Foam, Medium Density – Application".

Inspection Authorities at the time of inspection of each installation will require the submission of the documentation as specified by the Standard – CAN/ULC-S705-2, including but not limited to the following:

- Confirmation is to be submitted confirming that the foam system has been approved for use in Canada, (i.e. CCMC Listing for the product's manufacturer), and
- Confirmation is to be submitted confirming that the contractor is a Canadian Accredited Contractor, (i.e. CUFCA or other accredited Association), and
- A copy of the completed daily worksheet(s) for each installation, is to be submitted,
 and
- · A copy of the Job Site Label is to be submitted, and
- Confirmation is to be submitted confirming the on-site test results (i.e. installed depth "R" or "RSI" value/density, adhesion, cohesion etc.).

Without the submission of the above items the insulation Inspection cannot be approved and the *Spray Foam Installer* may be required to remove all of the *Spray Foam Material*.

Please be advised that a thermal barrier that complies with one of the interior finishes described in 9.29.4. to 9.29.9. of the NBC (i.e. drywall, plywood, particleboard etc.) shall be applied over the *Spray Foam Material*, when it is adjacent to occupied spaces in a building. This includes crawlspaces that are used as a plenum or used for storage or if there are any fuel burning appliances located in the crawlspace.
