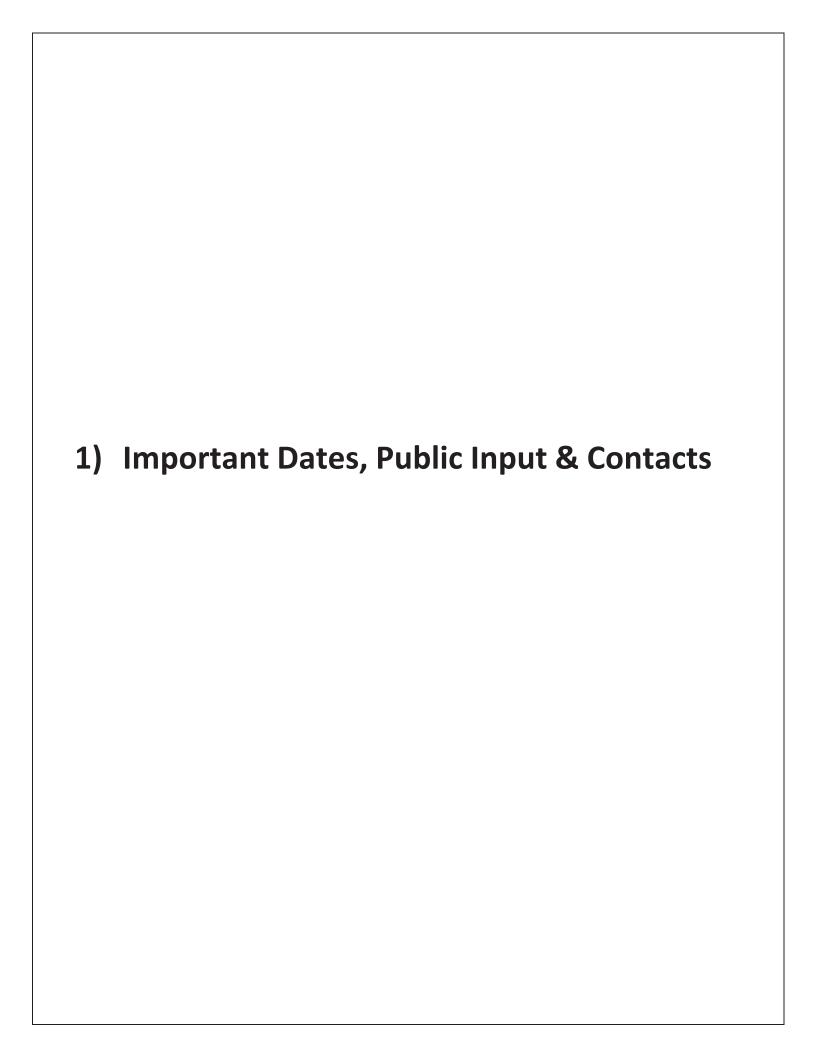

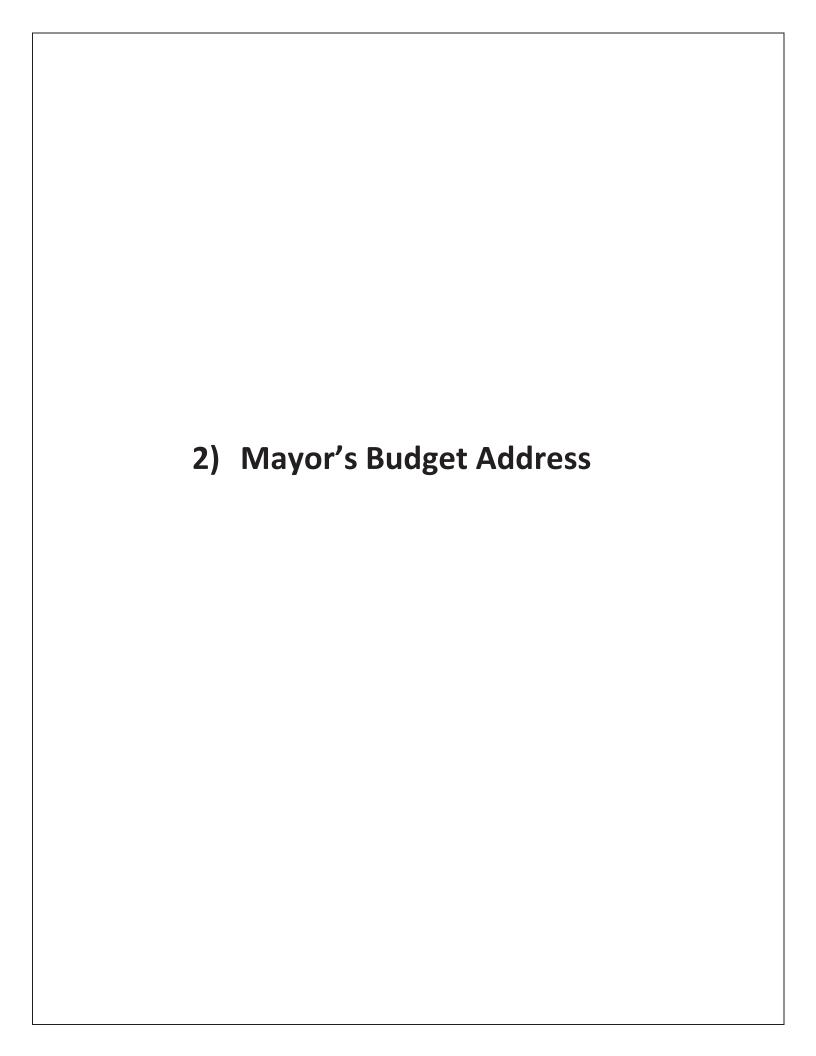

2022 Operating Budget Speech

Good evening members of Council, City Administration and residents of Whitehorse. It is my pleasure to be presenting the proposed Operating Budget for 2022, and the provisional budgets for 2023 and 2024.

The City's Operating budget is the blueprint that explains how its resources are allocated on a day-to-day basis.

As you may be aware, Council recently brought forward a \$53-million Capital Budget for 2022. The Capital Budget makes important investments in the community when it comes to infrastructure renewal, environmental sustainability, transportation and active living, and housing.

The operating budget, on the other hand, outlines the cost of daily services such as transit, road maintenance, snow removal, and recreation programs. It ensures the City of Whitehorse always has funding for firefighters, lifeguards, accountants, engineers, grader operators and many other employees who deliver the City's programs and services.

The total proposed Operating Budget to deliver these services to our residents in 2022 is \$93.4 million.

Council and Administration have worked hard to listen and to consider what Whitehorse residents have asked for, what they expect, and what they need to ensure we provide exceptional services while still keeping taxes and fees affordable.

This year's budget discussion took place, once again, against a backdrop of the continued financial effects of COVID-19.

The pandemic has affected just about every aspect of our lives, and the City's bottom line is no exception. As a result, it's been a delicate balancing act, more so than usual.

You will see that we have been mindful to keep property taxes reasonable, especially when many Whitehorse residents are feeling the financial pain of the pandemic.

Property taxes are a major source of revenue for any Canadian municipality. The City of Whitehorse only collects enough taxes to support its programs and services.

The proposed residential tax increase for 2022 is 2.65 per cent.

Though tax increases are not usually welcome, it is a necessary action in order to cover the essential services for our growing community. The proposed amount is significantly lower than the rate of inflation and also lower than the average increase in the assessed value of properties in Whitehorse.

In 2022, the average homeowner will pay \$67 more in taxes, which amounts to just over \$1.28 a week.

The average commercial property will pay an additional \$124 in taxes, or about \$2.38 a week.

I am pleased to announce that the Water and Sewer rate, which is not funded through taxes but rather recovered from ratepayers, will not increase in 2022. Monthly water and sewer rates will remain at \$85.85.

Those are the numbers, so let's talk about the services.

Whitehorse's population is now over 30,000, which represents an increase of almost 2,000 residents in the last two years. This rate of growth is expected to continue, and as the capital city, we need to be prepared for it.

More people means more demand on a variety of City services. This means roads for cars and more paths and trails for cyclists. An increased demand on our water and sewer system and, as we have seen the past two years, an increase in snow removal.

But it's not just an increase in population, it's also an increase in what people are asking for as we try to reduce our carbon footprint and adapt to climate change.

This Council has taken an active role in listening to residents' needs, concerns and ideas, and with that, we strive to provide excellent services to all residents, while keeping taxes at a reasonable level.

For many of you who wanted better access to public transportation, we heard you, and we're introducing Transit Sunday services. This new service enhancement, which also includes the Handy Bus, will follow established Saturday routes, schedules, and timings. Sunday service will help reduce the social and economic inequalities for those who can't afford to utilize alternative transportation, and it will help businesses ensure their staff can get to work on Sundays.

In addition to increasing service, Transit Services is also implementing a project to improve scheduling on existing bus routes, in order to better match demand. You'll see more stops at higher demand areas, making it more convenient for residents to get around the city during peak hours.

Our hope is that these enhancements will increase ridership through frequency, reliability, and spontaneous boarding. The outcome will be fewer vehicles on our roads, less congestion, and a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions.

We're also introducing bus service on recognized Yukon Public Holidays. This means Whitehorse public transit with be operating 363 days a year, except for Christmas and New Year's Day.

We have heard loud and clear from residents on the need to increase our snow removal services. We've experienced record amounts of snow in the past two winters, and it has been a struggle for our hardworking crews to keep up. We're allocating an additional \$240,000 in 2022 towards winter road maintenance. We are also adding new, full-time positions to our fleet and transportation team to operate the new equipment approved through the Capital Budget. This will provide us with greater capacity to manage snow

and ice control on roads and pathways, as we respond to changing winter conditions in Whitehorse brought on by climate change.

A growing community also calls for a greater demand on our fire department.

The department undertakes a number of activities including fire suppression, fire prevention, training, fire safety inspections, rescue, and building plan reviews.

Last year, Whitehorse Fire and Protective Services responded to 731 calls, which represents 53 more than in 2020. This proposed budget considers the hiring of 12 additional firefighters over the next four years, or three per year. This is an expensive addition but it would allow the department to address important staffing needs, to ensure that fire engines arrive on scene on time and with the minimum number of firefighters, in accordance with industry standards.

For the last few years we have heard from residents and contractors that our once timely service has not been able to match growing demand, and that more resources are needed in our Land and Building Services department. In fact, since 2017, the Land and Building Services department has consistently issued in excessed of 500 development permits each year.

As part of this proposed budget, new positions have been added within the Development Services division to address the recent building boom in Whitehorse. This proposed budget includes a new, full-time development officer to help offset considerable pressures in the department. An additional permanent client service representative is also being included in this budget, which would greatly improve service delivery times for the department.

In order to offset the enhanced service provided to the development community and as part of a larger initiative to review overall fee levels the City has taken the opportunity to realign some of the fees charged for services in the Land and Building Services area.

Important positions are also being added to the Recreation & Facility Services department.

Our summer day camps are one of the most popular programs offered by the City each year. They provide an affordable alternative to day care and play an important role in the health and wellness of the community, as they contribute to the social and physical development of a child's wellness. More full-time staff will be hired to compensate for the program's popularity.

Youth programs play an important part in the development of children, and this council continues to support opportunities to create safe, inclusive and quality programs for Whitehorse youth.

These are just some of the enhancements that we are proposing. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our residents, many of whom took the time to contribute their feedback and ideas on how Council can make our City an even better place to live. You will see many of your ideas captured in this budget.

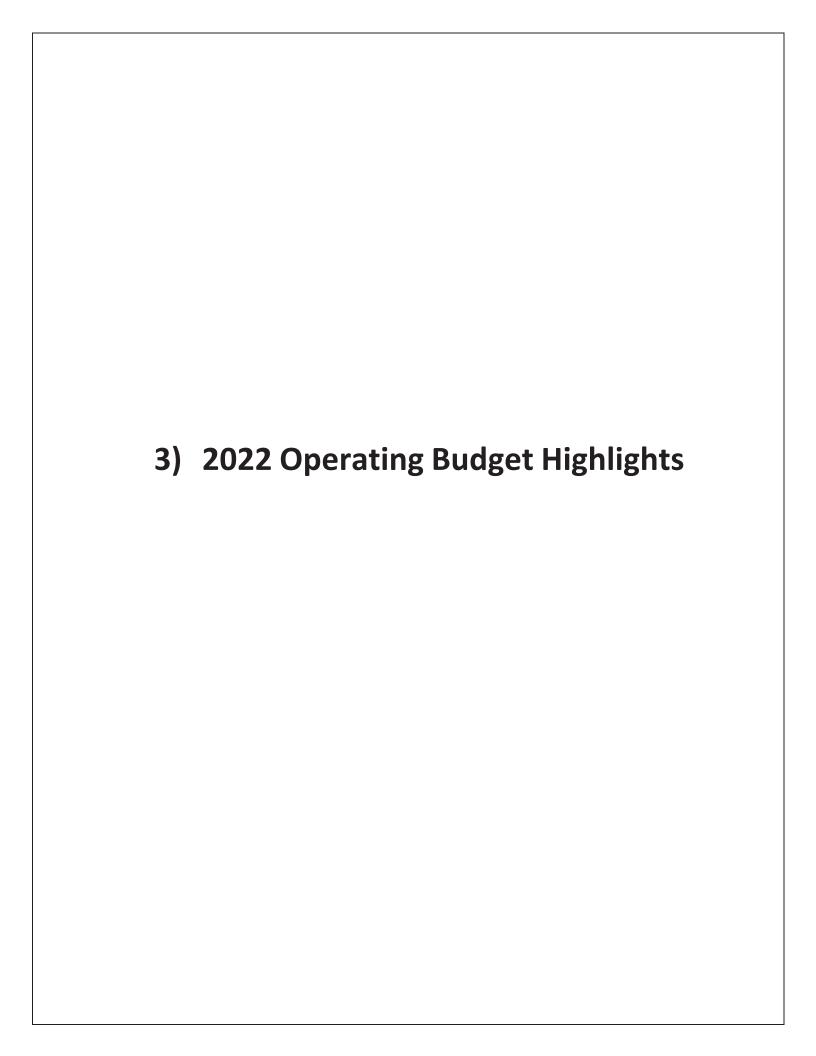

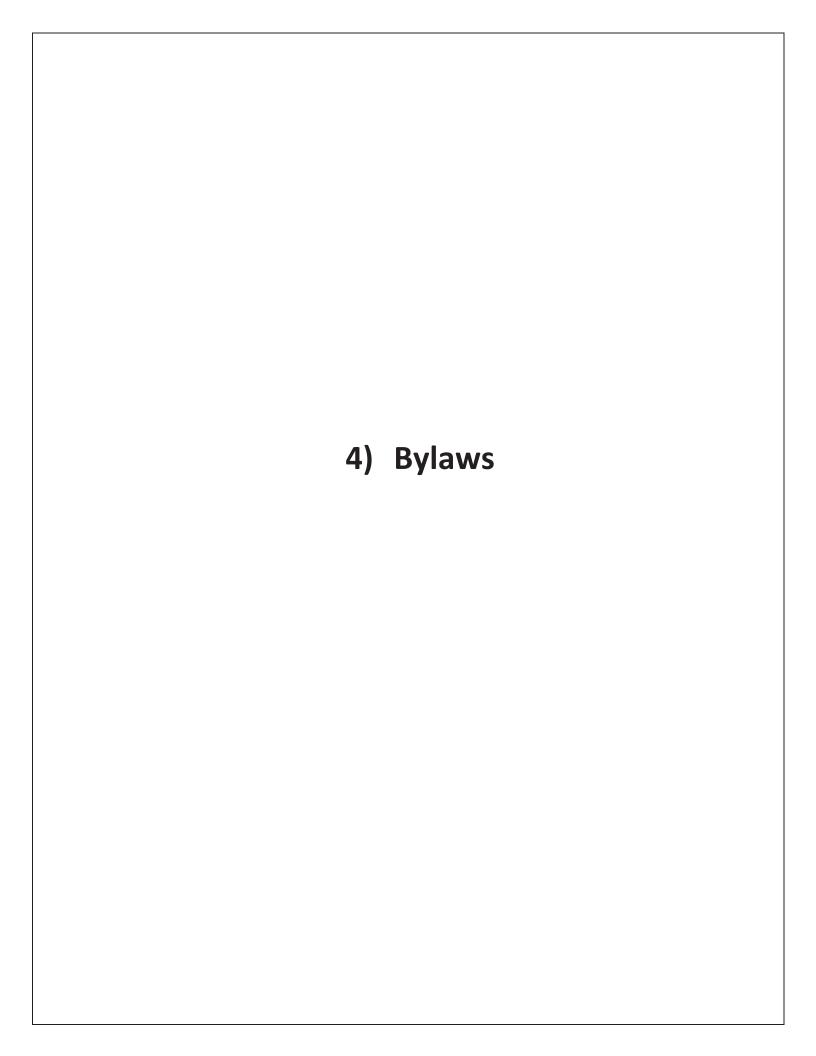

2022 OPERATING BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- Total Operating Budget is \$93.4 Million

CITY OF WHITEHORSE BYLAW 2022-01

A bylaw to adopt the 2022 operating budget and the 2023 and 2024 provisional operating budgets

WHEREAS section 238 of the *Municipal Act* (R.S.Y. 2002) provides that Council shall by bylaw cause an annual operating budget to be prepared and adopted; and;

WHEREAS section 239 of the *Municipal Act* provides that Council may establish by bylaw a procedure to authorize and verify expenditures that vary from the annual operating expenditure program;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the municipality of the City of Whitehorse, in open meeting assembled, HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The 2022 annual operating budget and the provisional budgets for 2023 and 2024, attached hereto as Appendix "A" and forming part of this bylaw, is hereby adopted.
- 2. No expenditure may be made that is not provided for in the 2022 annual operating budget unless such expenditure is approved:
 - (1) by resolution of Council to a maximum expenditure of \$500,000.00; or
 - (2) by bylaw for expenditures in excess of \$500,000.00.
- 3. Expenditures authorized in accordance with section 2(1) of this bylaw that result in an increase in total expenditures above what was approved in the 2022 operating budget shall be brought forward for final approval through an umbrella bylaw at year end.
- 4. The Director of Corporate Services is hereby authorized to re-allocate funds within the line items in Appendix "A" to a maximum expenditure of \$100,000.00.
- 5. The Director of Corporate Services and City Manager may jointly re-allocate funds between the line items in Appendix "A" to a maximum expenditure of \$100,000.00.
- 6. This bylaw shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on January 1, 2022.

CITY OF WHITEHORSE BYLAW 2022-02

A bylaw to levy taxes for the year 2022

WHEREAS section 55(2) of the Assessment and Taxation Act requires that each municipality shall levy taxes upon all taxable real property within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS section 55(3) of the *Assessment and Taxation Act* provides for the establishment of different classes of real property, and varied tax rates according to the class of real property to be taxed;

NOW THEREFORE the council of the municipality of the City of Whitehorse, in open meeting assembled, hereby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. In this bylaw,

EIDST DEADING:

- "Agricultural" means all property used primarily for agricultural purposes and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as AGR.
- "Non-Residential" means all property used primarily for commercial, industrial and public purposes and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as CH, CMC, CMH, CML, CR, CMS, INS, MHI, MSI, PI, PRC and QRY.
- "Residential" means all property used primarily for residential use and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as OSP, POS, RCM, REC, RMH, RR1, RSA, RSC, RSM, RS1, RS2 and TRA.
- 2. A general tax for the year 2022 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "agricultural" at the rate of 1.124 percent.
- 3. A general tax for the year 2022 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "non-residential" at the rate of 1.606 percent.
- 4. A general tax for the year 2022 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "residential" at the rate of 1.054 percent.
- 5. This bylaw shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on January 1, 2022.

A bylaw to amend Fees and Charges Bylaw 2014-36

WHEREAS all City of Whitehorse municipal fees and charges are consolidated into one bylaw; and

- The fee schedule attached to and forming part of Fees and Charges Bylaw 2014-36 is hereby amended by repealing existing Schedules 1 to 12 and substituting therefore new Schedules 1 to 12 attached hereto as Appendix "A" and forming part of this bylaw.
- 2. This bylaw shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on the 1st day of January 2022.

Explanatory Notes

The attached bylaw amends the Fees and Charges Bylaw to reflect changes required as part of the annual budget process. The schedules have all been reformatted and any fee rate changes are highlighted in blue to reflect as detailed herein:

- Effective January 1, 2022 increase the Parks Rental Fees and Cemetery Fees by 2%. This is the standard annual increase.
- Increase Recreation and Facility Services fees and charges by 2% effective September 1, 2022. This is the standard annual increase, affecting sports fields and arenas, pool, storage, memberships and admissions.
- Effective January 1, 2022 various Building and Development Permit fees will increase as well as Land and Building Searches and Certificates fees.
- Increase Waste Management Fees by 3.60% (\$4.00 per tonne).
- Increase other Waste Management Fees as indicated
