P R E F A C E

PIONEER CEMETERY

The Pioneer Cemetery on Sixth Avenue in Whitehorse was in operation from 1900 until 1965. According to Mrs. Otto Partridge's diary, the first burial was that of James Brown on October 11, 1900. By 1904 there were 22 burials in the cemetery. As early as 1902 there was a feeling amongst townsfolk that a new site should be found. In 1908 a new spot was considered, "ten acres downriver on the left bank", to quote the report in the Star newspaper. However, nothing came of this and the original location remained in use. After it had been surveyed in 1901, the Crown received title to the land and the officials of the Territorial Government were in charge of administration. Although the City of Whitehorse was established as a municipality in 1950, the City did not accept responsibility for managing the cemetery until 1965. Unfortunately, no consecutive records of burials were kept, apart from individual churches and the Masonic Lodge. About twenty years ago most of the wooden markers were removed in a misguided clean-up of the area. As a result, there is no complete record of individual gravesites, apart from those with stone monuments. There seemed to be a need for a compilation of as many as possible of the names of those at rest in the cemetery and this list is the result.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Information for the period up to the end of 1928 was gathered from records of the Territorial Government Department of Vital Statistics, the Anglican and Roman Catholic church records, and from microfilm records of the "Whitehorse Star" at the Archives. After this date, records at the Department of Vital Statistics were no longer available. It was therefore decided to leave the remainder of the names as they were shown in church records under the heading of the individual church. In some cases, additional details were found in the old newspaper records; however, all the files are not complete.

All obituaries were copied from the early Whitehorse papers. It is regretted that some names may have been missed.

In 1967, Mr. Konrad Domes set his class at the Vocational Institute the task of mapping Pioneer Cemetery. A copy of this map appears at the back of this book. As this was done before the destruction of the markers, it is the only record that remains. We are very grateful to Mr. Domes for his help and encouragement.

HISTORY OF LOCAL CHURCHES

Presbyterian Church

The first church to be active locally was the Presbyterian. The Rev. John Sinclair had come to Lake Bennett in 1897, conducting services in a tent for two years. Then on May 24, 1899 a wooden church was opened. This remained in use until March 1902, when work on the railroad was complete and there was no longer a reason for a community at Lake Bennett. In April, 1900 Mr. Sinclair had received word to move farther north to the end of the rail line at Whitehorse. Building materials were sent to the new community and a layman, A. Copeland, started services. For a few weeks Mr. Sinclair again had to preach in a tent. The permanent church building was on Main Street, near Second Avenue. Space was also available for a public reading room and the first grade school. The schoolroom was in operation until the Lambert Street school was built in 1902. The Presbyterian Church was active until around 1910. After a long quiet period, it was reactivated in 1957.

Catholic Church

On June 27, 1900, Father J. C. Lefebre of the Oblates and Brother A. Dumas, also O.M.I., arrived in Whitehorse from Dawson City to organize services for Roman Catholic parishioners here. They pitched a tent at the corner of what is now Wood Street and Fourth Avenue, with a larger tent set up to be used as the first Catholic Church. The permanent church was built a block south, at the corner of Steele Street and Fourth Avenue. The first church was dismantled to make room for a new cathedral which opened in 1959. One item from the original building, preserved and moved to the new structure, was the bell. It had been donated in 1901 by the McNamee family of Dawson City to the parishioners of Whitehorse.

Anglican Church

The Anglican Church or Church of England, known in the United States as the Protestant Episcopal, was active in the Yukon before the gold rush. In 1891, the Rt. Rev. William Bompas became the first Bishop of Selkirk with a church at Forty Mile. During the Klondike stampede, St. Paul's church in Dawson opened. In Whitehorse, the first services were held in August 1900 in a tent. By October of that year, the log church was completed. It served the community for many years as the only log cathedral in the world, and still stands today as a memorial to the pioneering work of missionaries in the north. The first rector of Christ Church was the Rev. R. J. Bowen, who arrived on August 1, 1900. In 1960, the old church was replaced by the larger modern structure next door, across Stringer Park. With the old church and rectory now restored, the park and the new cathedral make a most inviting vista for tourists and local residents alike.

United Church

The United Church in Canada was formed in 1925 through union of Methodists, Congregationalists and Presbyterians. The church opened here the following year with services being held in the original Presbyterian church on Main Street. The church carried on for two years, until the population no longer warranted two main protestant churches. Then in 1954 the church re-opened with the Rev. A. J. A. Chapple as minister. Services were held in various locations for three years until work began on the new church, designed by Vancouver architect Arthur Erickson. A striking feature of the building is the large beams. These were obtained by Mr. Erickson, it is believed, from a previously designed structure which was not built.

On the 25th Anniversary in 1983, the mortgage on the church was burned. Those taking part included the Minister and Treasurer from 1958, Rev. Chapple and Mr. D. E. McAllister, along with the present Minister and Treasurer, Rev. Don Lewis and Mrs. Irma Gordon.

Baptist Church

In 1957, the Baptist Church had been active locally for over ten years, with the Whitehorse Gospel Chapel and the Indian Baptist Mission School. The school for Indian children was begun in 1946 by the Rev. Harold Lee, because of illiteracy among native youngsters. The school was housed in former Army buildings and was assisted financially by Indian Affairs Branch. Mr. Lee was killed in a highway accident in 1952, but the work carried on at the Mission school until new government student residences were built. The new Baptist Church was built as a memorial to Mr. Lee.

For over fifty years no new churches were built here, but in 1957 two were under construction: the United Church at Sixth Avenue and Main Street, and the Whitehorse Baptist Church at Second Avenue and Rogers Street. To quote from a Whitehorse "Star" report of October 10th, "Construction of the new churches points to a growing maturity and stability for Whitehorse."

Lutheran Church

In 1960 the Lutherans had premises at 202 Steele Street. Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church was dedicated on Sunday, March 14, 1965. The Rev. I. M. Zimmerman, President of the Western Canada Synod, Lutheran Church in America, was the guest preacher at the special service. The new building, located at Fourth Avenue and Strickland Street in downtown Whitehorse, was dedicated on the fifth anniversary of Lutheran work in the Yukon. At the time the new church opened, the Rev. M.K. Gulbis was the Pastor.

Baha'i

The local Baha'i Administrative Council was established in April of 1959.

FRATERNAL ORGANIZATIONS

Masonic Lodge

One of the first fraternal organizations in Whitehorse was the Masonic Lodge. At a picnic held during the summer of 1901, it was found that there were about 40 Freemasons in the area, and it was decided to establish a lodge. The first organizational meeting was held on November 6, 1901. A dispensation to form a lodge, dated March 5, 1902, was received, and two months later officers were installed. On June 11, 1903 Warrant No. 81 was issued, constituting the Whitehorse Lodge.

The first lodge was held over Whitney & Pedlar's store on Front Street. After the 1905 fire that building was moved to First Avenue and Main Street (where it still stands as part of Horwood's Mall). In June 1906, the lodge leased the Imperial Hotel from Robert Lowe and all meetings were held there until June of 1967. The old lodge was demolished two years later. Lodge resumed on September 18, 1967 in the present temple on Lambert Street. At the time of the 75th Anniversary in 1977 there were 217 members.

United States Army

In March, 1942, the U.S. Army Engineers arrived in Whitehorse to begin the building of the Alaska Highway. A number of personnel, civilian as well as military, died as a result of various accidents during the two years of road construction. All casualties at the northern end of the road were buried in the local cemetery. Their graves were in three rows at the north-east corner of what is now the Pioneer Cemetery on Sixth Avenue. The American Army remained in the north to maintain the highway until April, 1946. At that time all United States citizens were disinterred and taken home to American cemeteries.

LOST GRAVES - Surname Index

The index that follows was prepared as an addition to the document 'Lost Graves' researched by Margaret Crook and Helen Horback and compiled by Norma L Felker. The brief notes below explain the conventions followed in the index.

Surnames: These are listed alphabetically. A person with more than one spelling of the surname has a separate listing for each spelling. Aliases also have a separate listing. If both married and maiden names are known each has a separate listing.

Given Names: All nicknames are presented in quotations. All maiden names are presented in parentheses. If a second married name is known it is presented in brackets.

Death Date: If only a burial date is known the date is preceded by "(b)".

Age: All ages of less than one year are indicated by "0".

Detail: This refers to any notes included about the person. "0" indicates no notes (although a place of residence is included for most records). "1" indicates a short note with scant information, perhaps just a cause of death. "2" indicates more detail including full obituaries.

Birthplace list: Approximately 20% of people listed in 'Lost Graves' have a birthplace documented. This list is provided as a cross-reference to known birthplaces.

It is hoped this index will assist those persons undertaking historical and genealogical research related to the Yukon.

Mr. Brown's funeral was the first in the Whitehorse cemetery. Following is the obituary which appeared in the October 13, 1900 issue of the "White Horse Tribune", along with a report of the Board of Trade resolution:

"THE DEATH ANGEL"

"There passed away from the earth last Tuesday morning at the Windsor Hotel, Mr. James Brown of the firm of Sinclair & Brown, Atlin. The cause of his death was pneumonia. Mr. Brown came here from Atlin about three weeks ago, accompanied by his wife. He was not feeling well at the time and shortly after took to his bed.

The funeral took place on Thursday morning from the Presbyterian Church, where a short service was conducted by Rev. Mr. Wright, the pastor, assisted by Rev. J. Pringle of Atlin and Rev. Mr. Bowen of the Church of England. At the close of the service a touching duet "Morning Land" was rendered by Mrs. and Miss Baird. The body, which was the first to be laid to rest in the new cemetery, was buried underneath the shade of some stately pines. Messrs. C. A. Munro, E. A. Dixon, F. McLennon and J. T. Bethune of Whitehorse and G. Sinclair and Captain Westcott of Atlin were the pall-bearers."

"RESOLUTION OF CONDOLENCE"

At the regular meeting of the Board of Trade held last Friday, the following resolution was passed:

"Whereas there has passed from our midst one who was deeply esteemed by those who knew him, we the council of the Board of Trade, representing the feeling of the citizens of Whitehorse, do now express our sincere sympathy and extend to his bereaved widow our heart-felt condolence in this her hour of sorrow and convey to her the sense of loss we also experience in his passing from our midst."

SELLAR, JOHN

Date of Death: October 5, 1900

NWMP Surgeon Dr. Pare reported Mr. Sellar's death by drowning, but his body was not immediately recovered. He may not have been buried here.

Shortly after his arrival he contracted typhoid fever, which when it had run its course, left him so weak that the seeds of the disease which carried him off had full scope. He came to this country in the spring of 1898 and, so far as is known, has no relations living. The funeral will take place Sunday at 2:30 from the hospital."

September 29, 1906:

"In the worst disaster of White Pass steamers, the 'Columbian' was proceeding to Dawson when Deckboy Murray and another man were shooting ducks from the deck. A poor shot hit the three tons of black powder on the forward deck, resulting in an immediate explosion. Captain O. J. Williams was able to turn the ship into shore and keep her there until a rope was secured to hold her. Mate Joe Welsh and Fireman Edward Morgan were thrown into the river and drowned; three deckhands, John Woods, Phil Murray and Carl Christianson (who had shipped aboard as John Smith), died before help could reach them. Purser L. C. Cowper died in hospital in Whitehorse. E. E. Winstanley, a Dawson miner who was working his passage, was badly burned but recovered. Some survivors floated a raft to Tantalus to wire the news. The steamer 'Victorian' came by and picked up the dead and wounded; she was met at Big Salmon by the 'Dawson', which had made the trip with her safety valve tied down, bringing Doctors Cade and Pare and Nurse Tollen. After that date, the British Yukon Navigation Company did not permit crew or passengers to use firearms aboard the steamers. He died later in hospital. He was buried with Masonic rites. The shipyards and businesses were both closed. Five months later, his friends, co-workers and employers purchased a stone which was erected in his memory."

The church was crowded and the Anglican Choir (of which Warren was a member) and the Presbyterian Choir led the procession to the graveside. The Anglican, Presbyterian and Roman Catholic clergy shared the service. Warren was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Coman; he had a younger sister, Marjorie. The Comans moved from Fort Scott, Kansas, last August."

He spent some time with Captain Martin last Wednesday, and complained of not feeling well. Captain Martin went to his home on Friday night and immediately sent for the Doctor. Dr. Clarke ordered him taken to the hospital; Captain Martin and an assistant hauled him there on a hand sleigh. He was an honourable, upright man, quiet and unassuming; he made few friends, but those he made testify of his worth and reliability."

BEAUCHAMP, BLANCHE

"Mr. and Mrs. Beauchamp lived at Bear Creek, 110 miles out on the Kluane Road. On February 8 she gave birth to a male child which, being prematurely born, lived but a few hours. At first there was every indication that the mother would recover, and as soon as she was able to travel, Joseph Beauchamp intended to bring her into town, with the body

of the baby for burial in Whitehorse. Complications (blood poisoning) set in, however, and she died on February 28. Being more than twenty miles from the nearest neighbour, Mr. Beauchamp was in a deplorable situation. He could not leave his wife during her illness to seek help, and after her death he had to prepare the body, make a box for it, and make the long journey into town with just the bodies of his wife and son for company. On his arrival here, he cabled Father Turnell in Skagway to ask him to take the funeral, as the Whitehorse priest was not here. Father Turnell came immediately, and the funeral took place on Sunday, the baby being placed in the mother's arms in the coffin. Mr. Beauchamp left on Tuesday for his lonely home."

KELSEY, RUTH

Age: 46

 Date of Death: May 28, 1913

"Mrs. Kelsey died as the result of burns suffered in a fire which destroyed the Dominion Hotel on May 17th. One of the first settlers here, Mrs. Kelsey arrived in March 1900. She was almost continuously engaged in operating restaurants or lodging houses, and may have been the proprietor of the first boarding house in town, located on Fifth Avenue near Main Street. Mrs. Kelsey is buried in Tacoma, Washington, where, according to the Whitehorse Star, 'several of her departed relatives rest'."

KOJOMOTO, K. (HENRY)

Age: 46
 Religion: Church of England
 Date of Death: August 15, 1913

"A pioneer resident of Whitehorse, Henry had been here for twelve years. He owned the Golden Eagle Hotel as well as the Central and Commercial Cafes. He was an excellent businessman and was remarkable for his liberality; he probably fed more moneyless men than any other restaurant proprietor in town. His wife and two children had returned to Japan some time ago and he was shortly to follow them. He was the acknowledged leader of the local Japanese and respected by everybody. He died of Bright's Disease, the same complaint having carried off his brother George seven years previously. He had embraced the Christian religion several years ago, so the funeral was held from the Anglican church; there were 103 persons at the funeral and the bearers were all Japanese men. The body was taken to the cemetery where, over the grave of his brother, the final rites were conducted, but instead of committing the body to the ground, it was taken to a secluded spot about a mile north of town where a temporary crematory had been constructed and where it was reduced to ashes, about six hours being required to complete the process. The ashes will be sent to his wife and children in Japan where, according to the custom of that country, they will be strewn to the winds of Heaven."

"Walker, a member of Foreman Burwash's crew, was employed on the Dawson Road about 14 miles north of Whitehorse. He had not been well for two or three days, although he had not ceased work. The crew started to move camp from the 12-mile post to Takhini Roadhouse. Walker volunteered to go ahead on foot. When the teams came along, he was lying beside the road dead, having walked about a mile. His body was sent into Whitehorse by wagon. Walker was a quiet man who owned quartz claims on Marsh Lake which he worked in the winter; he was believed to be a native of Ohio, and to have worked in Colorado for several years. So far as it was known, he had never married."

LOUGH, GEORGE

Age: 60
 Religion: Church of England
 Date of Death: December 20, 1913

"Very little is known about him; he was quiet and unassuming, and was very silent about his private affairs. He had a brother, Cavan, near Peterboro, Ontario. He came from outside in November, and rented a cabin from Hugo Snider, the shoemaker, on November 4th, since when he has been engaged in trapping and hunting near Whitehorse. It was his intention to go through to Chisana next spring. It appears that at one time he assisted in building a bridge near the Valerie Mine, so he must have been in the country previously. The police took charge of his funeral."

"Melis, formerly working at Pueblo Mine, was beaten to death by Romillio Caesari, who then placed the body under the ice in the river. It was discovered in June at the White Pass docks. Caesari, who had numerous possessions of Melis with him, was arrested in Dawson and brought back to Whitehorse for trial. He was found guilty and sentenced to hang; later the verdict was altered to imprisonment for life, as it was felt he was insane. He managed to escape custody, but was shot and killed. Melis was an honest, hard-working man, somewhat of a steadying influence among his fellow Italians. It was supposed that Caesari killed him in the course of a drunken quarrel."

"Born Nellie Piper, she was the wife of John Rosenberg, an employee of Taylor, Drury and Pedlar. She was born in West Plains, Missouri on January 21, 1894. Her mother brought her to Dyea, Alaska in 1898 and they came to Whitehorse in 1902 where they have resided ever since, with the exception of short periods spent in Dawson and Carcross. The Rosenbergs were married in October 1912. Nellie died suddenly; her parents and sisters were hastily summoned from down the river where they were camping but she never regained consciousness. Her happy disposition made her well loved and respected by all. The local stores were closed for the funeral, which was widely attended (at least 300 people); the local lodge of the Loyal Order of Moose marched beside the casket to the cemetery and the pallbearers were all young men, friends of the young couple. She left her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Langholtz, two sisters, Misses Mamie and Bernadine Piper, and an aunt, Mrs. F. E. Harbottle, her husband, and the entire town to mourn her untimely death."

"Ranta and Kala, both Finlanders, were sinking a shaft down from the 400-foot level of the Pueblo Mine by contract, and at the time of the accident, were preparing eight shots for discharge. Two of the fuses were lighted and an explosion occurred while the other six were being "spitted". Both men were experienced miners. Ranta's wife and child had just arrived from Treadwell to make their home at Pueblo. The inquest stated that no blame in any way attached to the management of the mine. It was the first fatality to occur at Pueblo."

For several winters he had been employed by the White Pass company as a stableman on the winter trail. His son Joseph and grandson James have been with him for several years, and were with him at the end. He had been in poor health nearly all winter and had been in the hospital for two or three weeks in March; a week ago pneumonia developed and death resulted. Besides his son, he leaves two daughters, both resident in Italy. A very large crowd turned out to pay tribute to the popular old man."

*"These four men, all railway section hands, were shot while they were eating their lunch by Alex Gagoff, a Russian, about three miles east of town. Gagoff, whose English was very limited, imagined that they were making fun of him. After killing the men, Gagoff took their handcar and rode into town, still carrying his 30/30. He told everyone that he met that he had killed the section crew, paid a bill at the White Pass Hotel, visited the drugstore, and was finally arrested by the police. After a short trial, he was found guilty on October 29. There was a good deal of fussing about sanity, but he was finally decided to be sane, and sentenced to die on March 10, 1916. Meanwhile, his cousin Tom Gagoff appeared, armed with a gun and determined to shoot Alex, as he and Alex were both Cossacks and "a Cossack does not die of hanging". After two unsuccessful tries, Tom Gagoff was deported to Russia. An interesting sidelight is that one of the murdered men had several hundred dollars sewed in his undershirt and a member of the RNWMP discovered this and appropriated the money. The crime was discovered, and the man was sentenced to serve three years in the New Westminster Penitentiary. On January 19, 1917 he was granted a ticket of leave to enlist in the forces."

He left Lower Lebarge for Braeburn, and was found by an Indian a short distance from where he had made camp (tent erected, dogs tied) in a sitting position by the trail. His wife, also an Indian, went to the camp and loaded her husband's body on one sleigh and the mail on another, but was forced to abandon the first by approaching darkness. The police brought it into Whitehorse; the jury ruled he had frozen to death. He was buried in the local cemetery on January 21, 1918 following church services which were conducted at the same time for Mr. Bernick."

*"These six men died as the result of a cave-in at the Pueblo mine. The investigation of the accident, made by RNWMP Captain A.L. Bell and D.J. McDonald, foreman of the Copper King mine, stated the cave-in or collapse of the stopes from the 200 foot to the 400 foot levels was an unavoidable accident; direct cause believed to have been from the many water courses which washed away the silt, sand, etc., which acted as binders. The Pueblo Mine is what is known as a wet mine, and there are many water courses throughout the property. It is probable that water had accumulated in some unknown chamber in such volume as to cause great pressure, and this pressure would find an exit at the point of least resistance and if such point happened to be in the hanging walls of one of the stopes it would naturally cause the cave-in or collapse; and if the hanging wall

gave way it would be natural for the pillar above, or the back, to fall in. The system of timbering in the Pueblo mine is what is known as square setting, a system which we consider the strongest and safest known. We consider every possible effort was made to rescue or recover the six unfortunate miners who lost their lives, and the rescue work was stopped only when the management of the mine found the shaft to be unsafe.

W.D. Greenough, the mine manager, said: "About noon Mr. Berg sent for me to come down to the 300 foot level, stating he had a cave-in in the mine. In company with Fred Porter, the engineer, I went to the 300 level and found that the west stope had caved and also ascertained that nine men were either in, or behind the cave. Mr. Berg, with the day bosses Adams and Domitrovich, had already started rescue work. I sent for Norman McLeod, the night boss, and the rescue work was continued as far as possible until the evening of the 29th, when it was found necessary to abandon the rescue work, together with the underground equipment and machinery, owing to the unsafe condition of the shaft. In my opinion the cave was caused due to the action of the water passing through some slips on the hanging wall side."

The mine was closed and no further shipments of ore were made for over ten years, until two shipments in 1929 and 1930. The old workings were never disturbed and the bodies of the six men were never recovered."

The RNWMP searched the river banks and combed the forest and underbrush without finding anything; a check of the Mining Recorder's books showed that all was in order. The Royal Order of Moose, to which he belonged, offered a \$100 reward, but it was not until August 14 that Chief Jim Boss found his body in the river. The jury at the Coroner's inquest found that he had died of drowning. Teddy was born in Rexton, N.B. He was employed as a bookkeeper by Sumner & Co. of Moncton, N.B., a position he left to come to Whitehorse. He prospected in Livingstone Creek, spent a time as bookkeeper for Taylor and Drury, and then went out again into the Kluane and Wheaton district before being appointed Mining Recorder for the Southern Yukon four years ago. He is survived by two married sisters and an uncle. The funeral service was conducted with the assistance of the Moose Lodge; the attendance was believed to the largest ever seen in Whitehorse."

The boat was picked up below the rapids with its side smashed and the stern of the little craft all stove in. Mr. Wilson leaves his wife, son Oliver and daughter Grace to mourn his untimely death. Mr. Dumontier was unmarried."

"Mr. Dumontier's body was recovered in August, 1923, and burial services were conducted by the Roman Catholic church on August 9, 1923. Mr. Wilson's body was found in 1925 by H.C. Lokken while hunting in the vicinity of Yukon Crossing. Mr. Wilson was identified by two gold medallions, one presented by the Yukon Order of Pioneers and the other by the Dawson Band. The Masonic Order and the Loyal Order of Moose (he was a member of both lodges) conducted graveside ceremonies."

"Born Fanny Pridham in Bristol, England, she married Otto H. Partridge and faithfully followed him to California and later the Yukon, climbing the Pass to do the latter. She lived in Bennett City, Mill Haven, and Ben-My-Chree, making a cozy home wherever she was (for some time, she also lived on a houseboat, called Ben-My-Chree as was the settlement on the Taku Inlet), planting a beautiful garden and keeping chickens. She was a gracious hostess, serving home-made wine to visitors, and playing to accompany their singing in the evenings. She kept a meticulous diary, recording the weather each day."

WYNEN, KATHERINE LUDOVICA

"A seamstress, from Belgium, she was a Romanist, buried by the Anglicans in the absence of an R.C. Minister."

"One of the pioneers of Whitehorse, 'Mike' was a wood merchant. He was born in New Brunswick, and he and his brother Antoine (Tony) came north in the very early days. In the absence of a Roman Catholic Priest, the Anglicans took the service."

"Born in Pennsylvania, he was one of the earliest merchants in town, forming a partnership under the name of Whitney & Pedlar, General Merchants; after some years, the firm was sold to Taylor & Drury. Mr. Whitney founded a brick yard, using local clay, but became more interested in the local copper mines in which he had extensive stock. The Masons handled his funeral."

Married during the early Klondike days to Miss Alberta Gerrie, he was steward on the Yukoner from 1901 to 1903; from there he went as Manager to the Windsor Hotel until it was destroyed in the fire of May 23, 1905 (the day his first son was born). He then ran the Pioneer Hotel until the White Pass Hotel was finished when he switched to it as Manager, a job he held until 1910 or 1911. After some years outside, he again came to work for White Pass & Yukon Route in 1923, returning each year since. This year he was seriously ill during the winter, but had seemingly recovered; he collapsed shortly after leaving Dawson. He left his wife and two sons, Donald and Clarence."

**CEDERBERG, GLADYS CLARINDA
(Davis)**

"The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Davis of Ladner, B.C., she married Frederick A. Cederberg, an employee of White Pass & Yukon Route, and moved to the north. She was "one of the most loveable women of the north, whose graciousness and generosity had endeared herself to the entire population of Whitehorse". A large number of friends attended the ceremony, and there were many beautiful floral offerings. She left three children, Frederick, Olga, and Shirley. Her death was the result of heart failure during childbirth."

O'CONNOR, DENNIS BRIAN

 Date of Death: July 23, 1934

"Denny' was born in Keelnaulla, County Cork, Ireland, and came north in 1898. He engaged in prospecting and mining in Nome and Fairbanks, Alaska, and in the Klwane district before returning to Whitehorse to work for Robert Lowe & Company. On July 28, 1908, he married Rose Tezler. He later worked for the Mail Service Department of White Pass & Yukon Route as a blacksmith and stage driver, and later still as driver for the Commissary Department. He had friends far and wide in the north; he had a fund of anecdotes, told with a droll Irish wit which was inimitable. Generous and kind, he assisted many a man who was "on his uppers". He died by drowning, his body entangled by a rope hanging from the White Pass dock. Although he was a Roman Catholic, in the absence of a priest the Anglican Church took the ceremony, which was crowded by his many friends."

Once he was promoted in 1912 to the position of Chief Engineer, he used to say, he worked on them all again...and all the rest of them, too. In the spring of 1934, he transferred to the Atlin division, serving on the Tutshi, mainly for health reasons. He was a competent and valuable officer, quiet, courteous, and unassuming, and made many friends. He was found dead in his room on the Tutshi, a victim of a heart attack; his wife was visiting in Island Falls, Maine, at the time."

WILLIAMS, RUSSELL JAMES

"Born on August 27, 1933, 'Rusty' was cheerful and gay, a real favorite with all the residents of Whitehorse. He was always a robust child, but recently symptoms of a lung disease appeared and he failed rapidly. Son of Mr. & Mrs. H. Williams, his death came as a distinct shock to everyone. Mr. Williams is employed with Yukon Consolidated Gold Corp. in Dawson; while he is away his wife is staying with her mother."

HAMACHER, EPHRIM J.

"E.J.' was born on June 10, 1857 in Kitchener, Ontario. After travelling extensively through the west, he settled in Yakima, Washington in 1883, practising his photography, until news of the Klondike drew him north. He arrived in Whitehorse in April, 1900, and left it only twice afterwards, in 1907 to visit his home, and in 1930 to go to Arizona for his health. As a professional photographer, E.J. is known far and wide. An ardent sportsman, he was a foremost exponent of curling and marksmanship on the rifle range. He was also a member of the town band. A gentleman of the old school, E.J. was noted for his courteousness and affability in all circles, and will be missed by the entire community. His short illness and death interrupted a business career that dates back to the turn of the century."

He later served as pantryman on several of the B.Y.N. (British Yukon Navigation) boats, and was cook for the police barracks. Later he owned and operated the roadhouses at Takheena and Yukon Crossing. He is understood to have accumulated two fortunes, one of which he lost in a hotel venture in Vancouver, and the other in a restaurant in Victoria. Many local residents attended the funeral (conducted by Rev. G.A. Cross)."

He went from there to Dawson and in 1933 came to Whitehorse; after a few months, he left to work for White Pass as a section hand, located at Log Cabin. He died as a result of injuries sustained in a accident about a quarter of a mile south of Log Cabin. The services were taken by the Masons; he was buried beside his wife, who had died about three years before. He left a son, who is employed by C.S. & M. in Atlin."

BRUCE, A. G.

"In the early days, Mr. Bruce came in over the old telegraph line (on which he was employed) from Ashcroft, having been in the Kootenays prior to that. A familiar figure around town, known to young and old alike, his passing will be mourned by a large number of his friends. He died in his sleep at the hospital. In the absence of a resident rector, Mr. G.C. Dingle read the service."

1939**MARCOTTE, J. E.**

"'Eddie' was born in 1861 in St. Basile, Quebec, the sixth child in a family of nine. His mother was of Norman stock, and his father came from Brittany. He first commenced in the jewellery business in Quebec City, later moving to Waltham, Mass., where he operated his own first-class jewellery store; this he sold, and operated as a log scaler for a time.

In 1901, he apprenticed as a barber in Duluth, and in July of that year came up to Skagway. He prospected for a time with Gus Jensen at Bennett, B.C., coming to Whitehorse in 1902. After working for Frank Young and Locasto as a barber, he started his own shop in 1903, which he later sold, going prospecting in the Alsek district, where he had ten claims. He continued to work as a barber on Sundays at Jack McLean's Ruby Creek Roadhouse. He returned to Whitehorse and opened a barbershop in the Windsor Hotel (destroyed by fire in May, 1905) and continued to operate at various locations until his death. In 1915 he commenced his fox farm on the other side of the river; it was extremely successful. About the same time he bought the old Commercial Hotel from Robert Lowe; it was later completely destroyed by fire. He died of pneumonia; his service was conducted by W. Tinney. There were a great many people in attendance."

PATERSON, BERTHA

"The wife of W.A. Paterson, manager of the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Mrs. Paterson was born in Ayr, Scotland, where she was married in March, 1918. She came to Prince Rupert, B.C., and later lived for a time in Matsqui and Vancouver before coming to Whitehorse in 1934. Possessed of a cheerful, optimistic spirit and winning personality, she took an active interest in the social and cultural life of this community, as well as in its social welfare work. She had entered hospital for an operation, and was progressing well, when she suddenly collapsed and died. In her memory, the stores were closed during the funeral; there was a large attendance of friends. She leaves, as well as her husband, a daughter, Betty, and a son, Jimmie, and relatives in both Scotland and England."

PAGE, "PADDY"

"Born in Ireland, he came north to Carcross in 1916. He leaves an elderly mother in Toronto."

In 1900 he left for Livingstone Creek and engaged in mining as well as operating a hotel; after a number of years there, he returned to Whitehorse and entered the service of Taylor and Drury as their manager at Carmacks, where he remained until his death. He was beloved by all; he never allowed anyone to go hungry from his door. He was a Mason, and the services were conducted by the Lodge. He leaves relatives in Vancouver and eastern Canada."

CHAMBERS, ROY

"Victim of an accident, Roy Chambers was thrown from his father's truck when the latter slowed to drive around a puddle on the road. His neck was broken in the fall. The accident occurred about 31 miles from Whitehorse. He is survived by his parents and two older brothers."

He is survived by his wife, his sister Shirley (of Whitehorse), his father and mother and two sisters of Chilliwack, another of McLure, B.C., and a brother of Calgary."

The church was filled to capacity; many friends from points along the line attended. He died suddenly, the result of a paralytic stroke. He leaves a wife."

THOMAS, CHARLES VICTOR

"Born in Wales and having served in the Royal Navy, Mr. Thomas came to the Yukon about 20 years ago. Possessed of a pleasing disposition, he was well liked. He was found dead in his cabin by William Grant; death was due to heart trouble. He leaves a wife."

Ken McLean's body was shipped to Edmonton. Two U.S. Army chaplains (Capt. Erwin T. May and Lieut. F.H. Austin) assisted at the military funeral; the Guard of Honour was formed from officers from army headquarters. Both coffins were covered by the Union Jack and the Stars and Stripes, while the firing squad was composed of an equal number of white and coloured troops from the U.S. Army. Les left his wife, and his mother and father. Don left his wife.

The plane was evidently being checked out after mechanical work was done on it; this was evidenced by the fact that the engine of their truck up at the airport was left running due to the extremely low temperature prevalent at the time. The paper said, "Few knew the northland better than Les and none were more popular than he in aviation circles. The tragedy is that the skill and ingenuity which he had so often and so unselfishly displayed in his many mercy flights for the benefit of others he was unable to apply to save his own life and those of his companions who died with him."

'Charlie' was born in Pisquet, P.E.I. on December 16, 1871. As a youngster he came to the State of Maine, and was a member of a Fire Department there, where he made a name for himself in weight lifting contests, and at Robinson he has often astonished us by juggling a full length of railroad rail. He followed the gold rush trail up the Stikine River to Telegraph Creek, and was engaged as a packer on the famous trail. One of his interesting stories recounted a situation in deep snow where horses were trained to walk on special adapted snowshoes. When Atlin, B.C. became a gold camp, Charlie hauled his own sled from Teslin to Atlin. Later he joined the construction crew of the White Pass Stage Line between Whitehorse and Dawson, handling the reins on a concord stage and on winter freight and stage sleighs. Settling at Robinson many years ago, his name has always been associated with any mining developments in the Wheaton and Watson River districts. He hewed his living from the Yukon Hills in mining, wood-cutting, lumbering, and all activities the out-of-doors offered. He never saw Skagway, and never took a trip "outside"; he took great pride in this.' Mr. McConnell entered the hospital on Thursday for an operation; he died on Sunday."

In 1898 he and a group of adventurous young men took the 'poor man's route' from Ashcroft, ending up in Telegraph Creek in the fall. From there he travelled to Atlin and Discovery. Here he met Isaac Taylor, and the two formed the beginnings of "Taylor & Drury Ltd." After a year at Discovery and Atlin, they moved to Bennett and opened a store there, moving again to Whitehorse when the railway was completed. The general store branched out and trading posts were established in Indian settlements; Bill's main interest was fur-trading, and he became well-known and respected throughout the fur-trading world. In 1917 he met and married Lucy Evans; he continued to spend his winters in the stores and his summers travelling to their trading posts; he used to brag that he was the slowest man in getting to the Klondike Gold Fields--he finally made it to Dawson in 1933. He was a Mason for 51 years, a Kiwanis, and elected to the first Board of Trade. He was active in business until his death. He was taken ill during the weekend, and died on Monday. He leaves a wife and two children, Bill and Mary."

W. D. MacBride writes: "I was reminiscing in my office on October 11 with Nels Nielsen, who was born in Stavenger, Norway, about 78 years ago. Nels went up the Stikine River with McKenzie and Mann in 1897, who were going to build a railway from Telegraph Creek to Dawson City. The Canadian Parliament failed to ratify a previous agreement, and the job was a bust, so Nels landed in Skagway in the spring of 1898, working for the White Pass. He worked on the road for a while and then went trapping in the Champagne-Dalton Post area; took unto himself a wife and raised a large family. Later he joined forces with Fred Langholz in a freighting service known as Langholz and Nielsen, carrying supplies to the Shushanna Gold Fields, via Kluane Lake in 1912 and 1913. Eventually he became night watchman and janitor of the White Pass and Yukon Route; he was always on the spot in the depot, courteous but tough on any transients who wanted to sleep on the floor. He had just told me a joke, laughed, collapsed, and died."
