Bylaw 2022-40, a bylaw to adopt the 2022 Official Community Plan, "Whitehorse 2040", and repeal the 2010 Official Community Plan.

The City has been working on developing a new Official Community Plan (OCP) to replace the 2010 OCP. The OCP guides decision-making for the City by setting the long-term vision, guiding principles and supporting policies for City growth and services. After the OCP is adopted by City Council, work produced by City departments must align with the guidance provided by the plan.

Bylaw 2022-40 received first reading on August 8, 2022. Notices were published in the Whitehorse Star and Yukon News on August 12 and 19, 2022. Advertisements were presented on CKRW, CHON-FM, the weekly City News highlights, and social media. Please be advised there will be a Public Hearing at the Regular Council meeting on September 12, 2022, to hear from interested parties related to the following Zoning Bylaw amendment.

Bylaw 2022-27, a bylaw to amend the zoning of 2220 Second Avenue from CS-Service Commercial to CSx-Service Commercial (modified) to allow for a cannabis retail operation located 100 metres of a school.

The City has received an application to rezone 2220 2^{nd} Avenue from CS – Service Commercial to CSx – Service Commercial (modified) to allow for a Retail Service, Restricted premise on a site located 100 metres from a school.

The Cannabis Control and Regulation Act (the Act) requires that a cannabis retail store be located more than 150 metres from a building that is, or is part of, a secondary school. The proposed cannabis retail store is within 150 metres of the Independent Learning Centre building. A provision of a municipal bylaw however prevails over the requirements of the Act. The proponent is therefore seeking to amend the City's Zoning Bylaw to allow a cannabis retail store located more than 100 metres from a school.

Bylaw 2022-27 received first reading on July 25, 2022. Notices were published in the Whitehorse Star and Yukon News on July 29 and August 5, 2022. A notice sign was placed on the subject site and property owners within 100 metres were notified by mail. The Kwanlin Dün First Nation, Ta'an Kwäch'än Council, and the Government of Yukon's Land Management Branch, Department of Education, Department of Health and Social Services, and Yukon Liquor Corporation were notified by email.

Please be advised there will be a Public Hearing at the Regular Council Meeting of September 12, 2022, to hear from interested parties related to the following Zoning Bylaw amendment:

Bylaw 2022-31, a bylaw to amend the zoning of a portion of three parcels at Puckett's Gulch/Airport from PE – Environmental Protection to IAx(a) – Airport (modified).

The Government of Yukon (YG) applied on behalf of the City to rezone a portion of City land in Puckett's Gulch near Erik Nielson Whitehorse International Airport (Airport). The purpose of the rezoning is to add a 150 metre runway end safety area to an existing runway, and move an airside road, fence, and section of the Airport Trail in order to come into compliance with Canadian Aviation Regulations. A sanitary sewer line will also be relocated. As the portions of the subject parcels are currently owned by the City, further steps will be required to allow for the transfer of land to YG should Council approve the rezoning.

YG held a Public Information Session on August 31, 2022. The public had the opportunity to view a video that illustrated what the area, including the trail, would look like after the completion of the proposed project. The public also had the opportunity to clarify information and pose questions to the YG project managers and engineers.

Bylaw 2022-31 received First Reading on August 8, 2022. Notices were published in the Whitehorse Star and Yukon News on August 12 and 19, 2022. A notice sign was placed at the bottom of the Black Street Stairs and property owners within 100 meters were notified by mail. The Government of Yukon Land Management Branch, Kwanlin Dün First Nation, Ta'an Kwäch'än Council, and the Downtown Residents Association were notified by email.

Your Worship, the Corporate Services Committee respectfully submits the following report:

1. Second Quarter Capital Budget Variance Reporting

The Committee was presented with the Second Quarter Variance Report on the Capital Budget projections which included a high-level summary of anticipated capital spending and proposed amendments to the 2022-2025 Capital Expenditure Program.

Although there have been some delays due to factors beyond the control of the City, many projects are proceeding as planned. Several are expected to come forward through the re-budget process or be resubmitted as part of the 2023 budget process, and one project has been canceled. These projects are not included in this report.

Four projects have been completed under budget, and due to this, a budget amendment is recommended to reduce the 2022 Capital Budget by \$109,393, with the funds returning to a mix of reserves and external funding. Additional information was

requested about re-budgeted projects, along with the status of external funding for Range Road Lift Station project.

The recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council authorizes amendments totalling \$109,393 to reduce the 2022 to 2025 Capital Expenditure Program.

2. Second Quarter Operating Budget Variance Reporting – For Information Only

The Committee was presented with the Second Quarter Operating Budget Variance Report on the 2022 Operating Budget, which included a high-level summary of anticipated operating spending.

The 2022 second quarter variance projection indicates that total operating revenues are expected to be over budget by \$199,896 and expenses may be over budget by \$169,214. Therefore, projections to December 31, 2022 as compared to the revised budget, indicate an operating surplus of \$30,682.

The Committee inquired if the initial 25% increase in transit ridership, from when the City had temporarily halted the collection of transit fares, had continued after fare collection began again. Administration noted more information will be available when the numbers are reviewed later this year.

3. Commencement Report – Motor Grader

This project involves the supply and delivery of one Motor Grader which is essential to the operation of the City's snow and ice control and road maintenance programs. The purchase was originally planned for the 2023 budget and was advanced to 2022 due to current long lead times for equipment and industry supply issues. In accordance with the Procurement Policy, procurements estimated at over \$500,000 such as this, must be authorized by Council.

It was also noted that there may be at least two local companies capable of bidding on this project.

The recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council authorize Administration to commence the procurement of project 320c01022 – Supply and Delivery of One Motor Grader.

4. Project Scope and Budget Amendment – Wood Street and Steele Street

Administration presented a scope Amendment for the Wood and Steele Street reconstruction project, which covers Front Street to 2nd Avenue, to substitute the Steele Street portion with a portion of Jarvis Street.

The underground utilities on both Wood and Steele Streets are considered to be approaching the end of their service life; however, the road surface on Wood Street has deteriorated beyond a useful state while Steele Street is still in acceptable condition.

Jarvis Street was identified in the 2022-2025 Capital Expenditure Program for reconstruction in 2023 due to the deteriorated road surface, gaps in sidewalk infrastructure and aging sewer infrastructure.

The Committee inquired about potential changes to traffic lights on 2nd Avenue related to this project. Administration noted that before any changes are made to traffic signals, the effects each option could have on the City's traffic grid as a whole will be evaluated and that accessibility will also be considered with any changes or upgrades.

The recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT the scope change to amend Capital Project #240c00321 to be Wood and Jarvis Street Reconstruction – Front Street to 2nd Avenue, be approved.

5. Association of Yukon Communities Motion to Change Council Terms

The Committee noted its support for the Yukon Government considering the Association of Yukon Communities' motion to extend municipal Council terms from three to four years. Yukon Government is currently holding a public engagement on this issue, and the Committee will be keenly interested to learn what the public thinks.

Your Worship, the City Planning Committee respectfully submits the following report:

1. Zoning Amendment – Ta'an Kwäch'än Council Parcel C-9B

Administration presented an application to amend the zoning of a portion of Ta'an Kwäch'än Council Settlement Land Parcel from FP (Future Planning) to RCT (Comprehensive Residential Townhouses) for a proposed residential development. The 20-hectare parcel is located in the neighbourhood of Whistle Bend, north of Witch Hazel Drive. The proposed rezoning is for a portion of the parcel, approximately one hectare.

TKC intends to construct a residential development for TKC citizens that will result in approximately 24 affordable townhouses. In the future, there may also be an option to offer leases or other possible residential development opportunities. The zoning would allow for a mixture of housing in conjunction with other residential development on TKC Settlement lands and will be compatible with the adjacent residential neighbourhood, as lots nearby are zoned RCT.

TKC also clarified that the road, location and orientation of the development have been designed to allow the road to be extended in the future for servicing additional developments on the parcel.

The Committee noted that there is a continued need to accelerate the Whistle Bend traffic management planning, and requested an update on the subject. Administration indicated that Whistle Bend traffic management was part of the overall Transportation Master Plan, which will be presented at an upcoming meeting with Administration in mid-October.

The recommendation of the City Planning Committee is

THAT Bylaw 2022-35, a bylaw to amend the zoning of TKC Settlement Land Parcel C-9B, to allow for a residential development, be brought forward for consideration under the bylaw process.

2. Zoning Amendment – Ta'an Kwäch'än Council Parcel C-16B

Administration presented an application to amend the zoning of a portion of a Ta'an Kwäch'än Council Settlement Land parcel from Future Planning to Residential Single Detached (modified) for a proposed residential development. The land Parcel is a 4.35-hectare parcel, located at 1805 Birch Street in the neighbourhood of Porter Creek.

This rezoning allows TKC to provide a mixture of housing in conjunction with other residential developments currently going through the rezoning process. The proposed development will provide affordable housing for TKC citizens in immediate need and allowing mobile homes as a principal use provides a greater variety of options across their various residential developments. This zone, which includes mobile homes, is also compatible with residential neighbourhoods in the area.

TKC confirmed that they intend to explore additional residential development options, including leasehold titled parcels, for future residential development opportunities.

The recommendation of the City Planning Committee is

THAT Bylaw 2022-35, a bylaw to amend the zoning of TKC Settlement Land Parcel C-9B, to allow for a residential development, be brought forward for consideration under the bylaw process.

3. Zoning Amendment – 12 Sybil Circle

An application was presented to amend the zoning at 12 Sybil Circle from Restricted Residential Detached to Restricted Residential Detached (modified) to allow a garden suite as a secondary use. The subject property is located near the intersection of Casca Boulevard and Sybil Circle in Whistle Bend. Properties to the west of the property, on the other side of the road, are zoned Comprehensive Residential Multiple Family 2 and Cottage Cluster Homes. East of the subject property is zoned Greenbelt.

Rezoning the subject property to allow a garden suite would not contrast with the surrounding area. Garden suites are required to have a gross floor area of 100 square metres or less and a height of 7 metres or less, and therefore, can resemble accessory structures which are permitted in the zone.

The recommendation of the City Planning Committee is

THAT Bylaw 2022-37, a bylaw to amend the zoning of 12 Sybil Circle, to allow a garden suite as a secondary use, be brought forward for consideration under the bylaw process.
