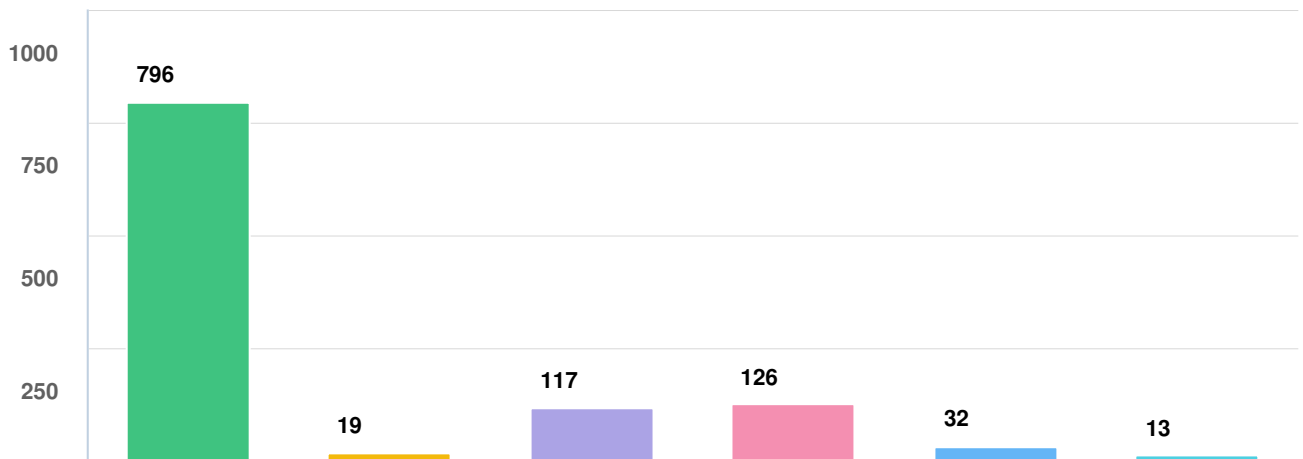

What is your main mode of transportation during the winter?

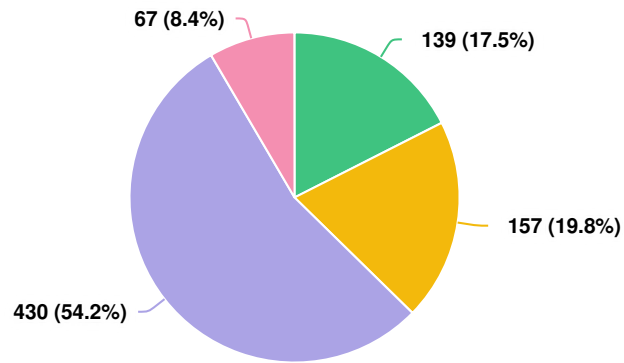

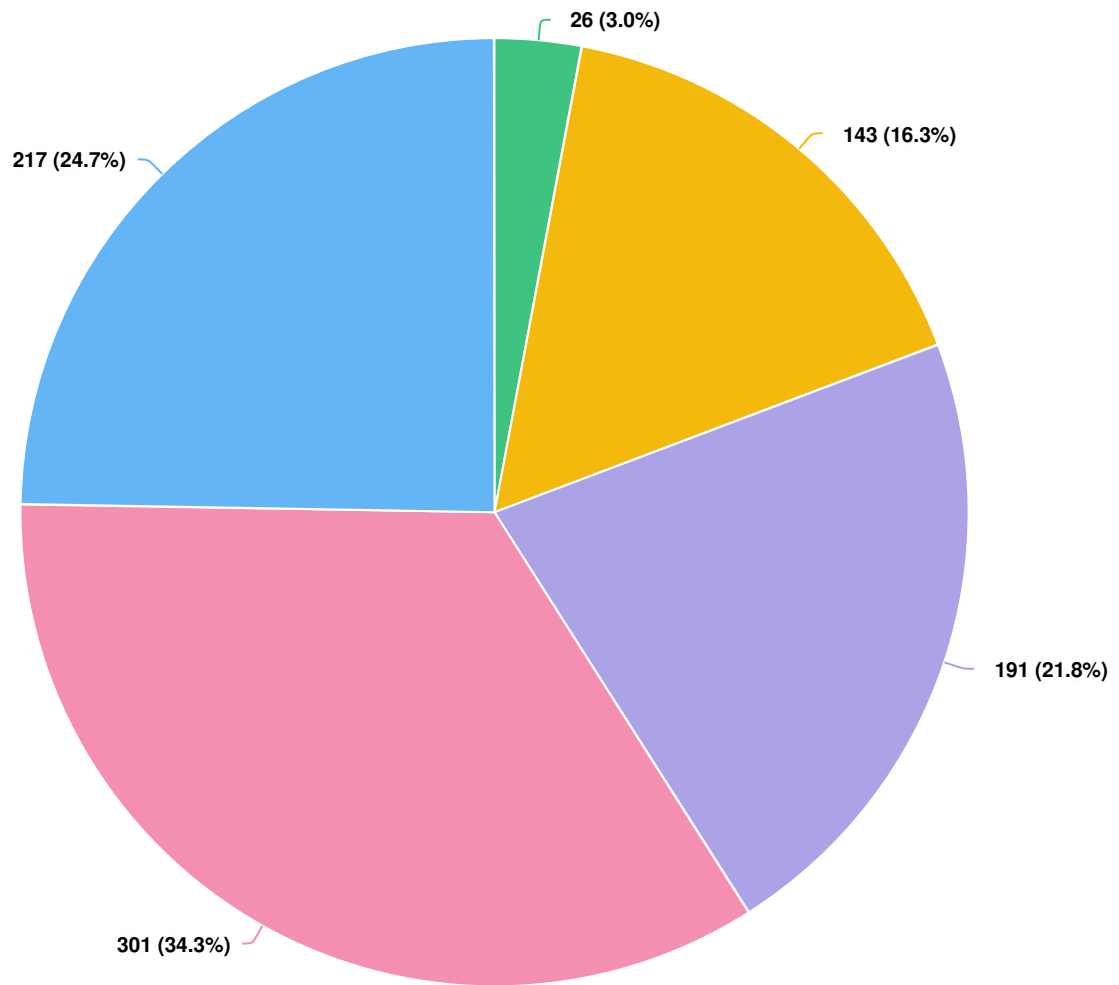

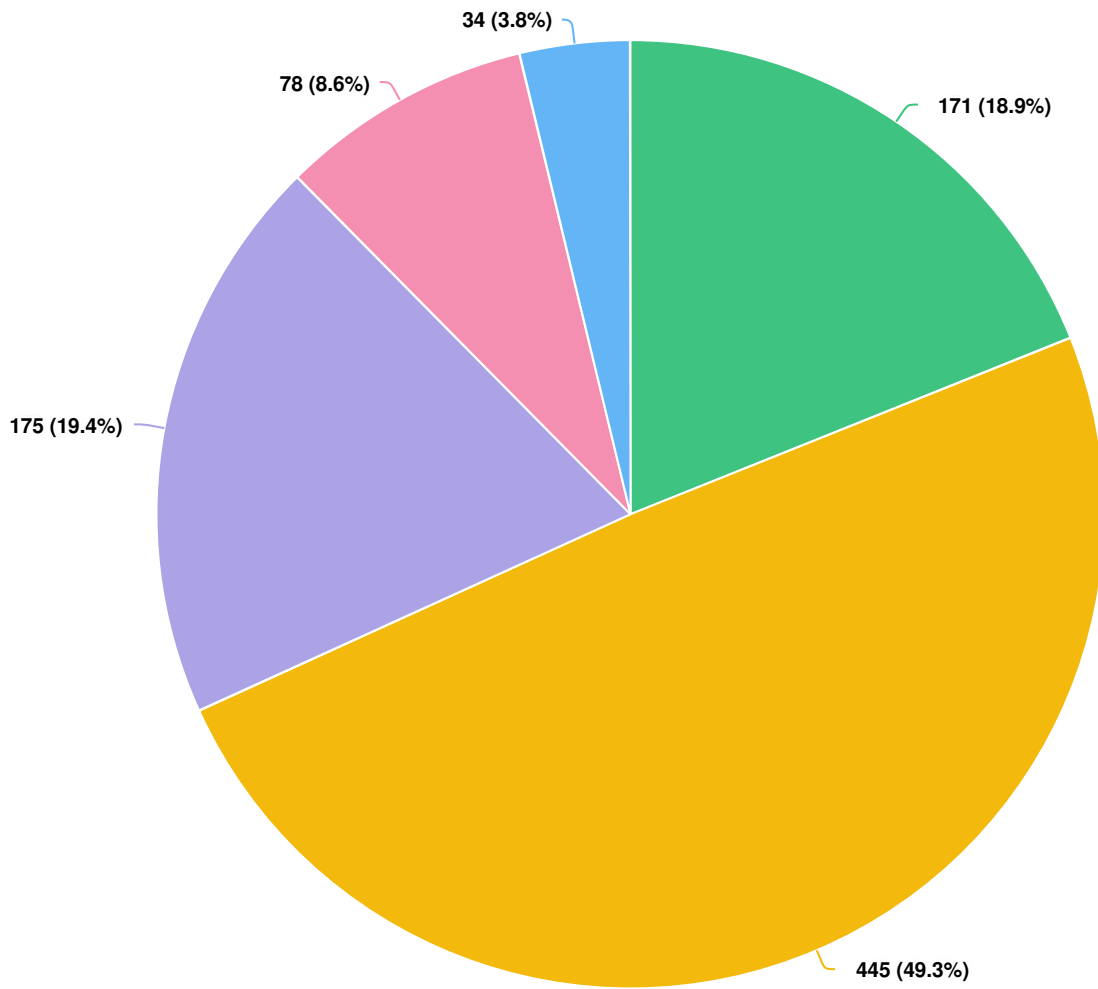

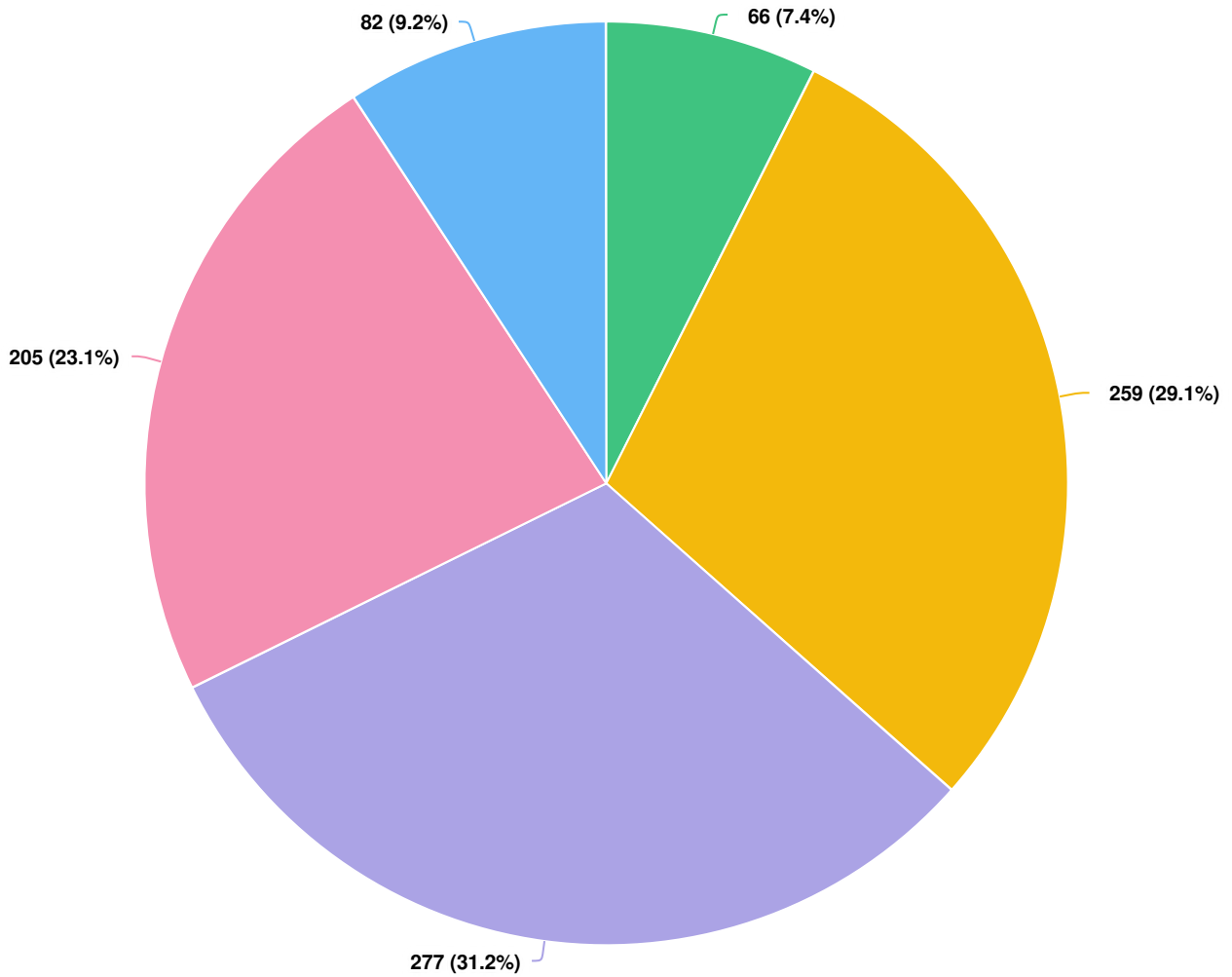

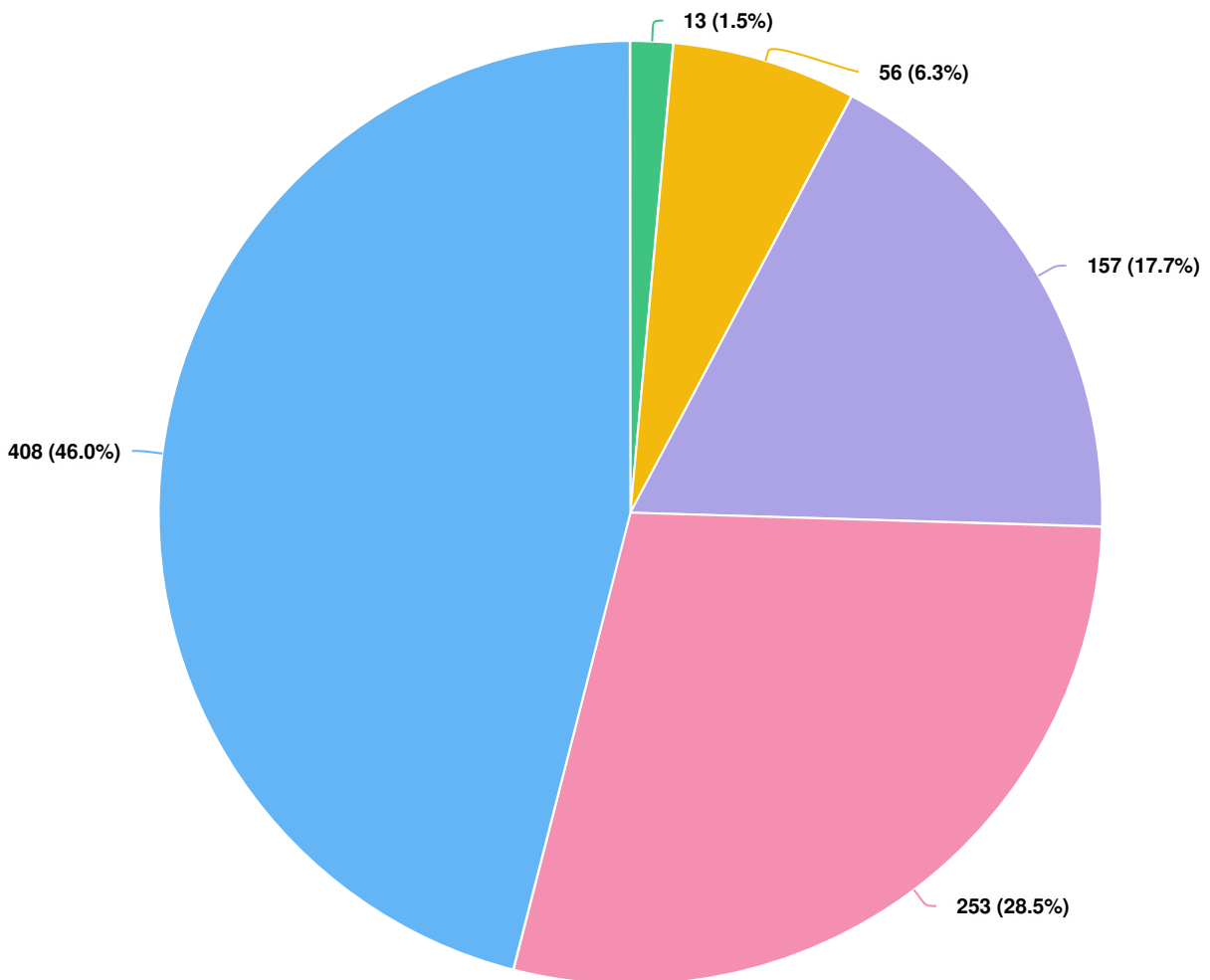

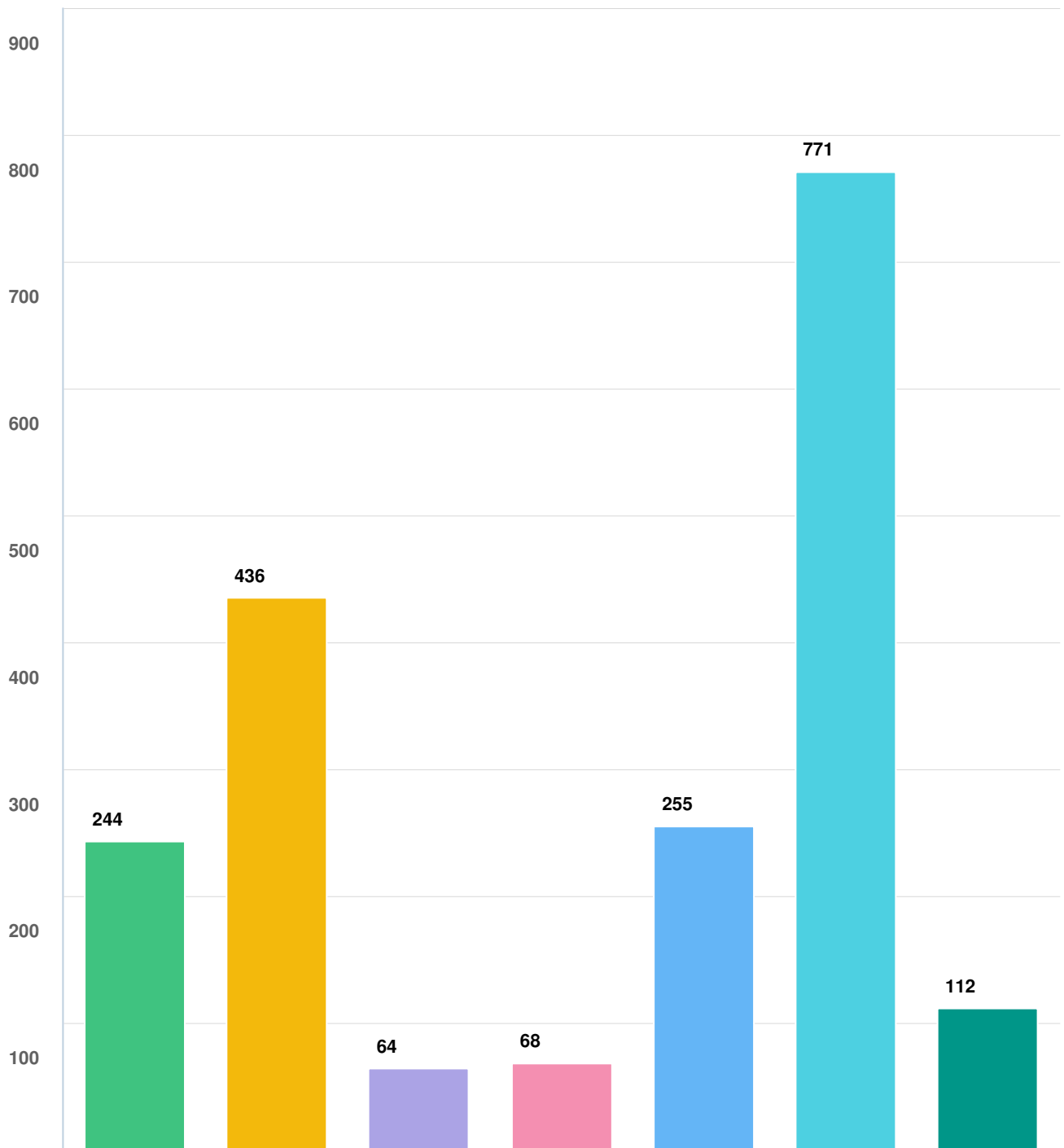

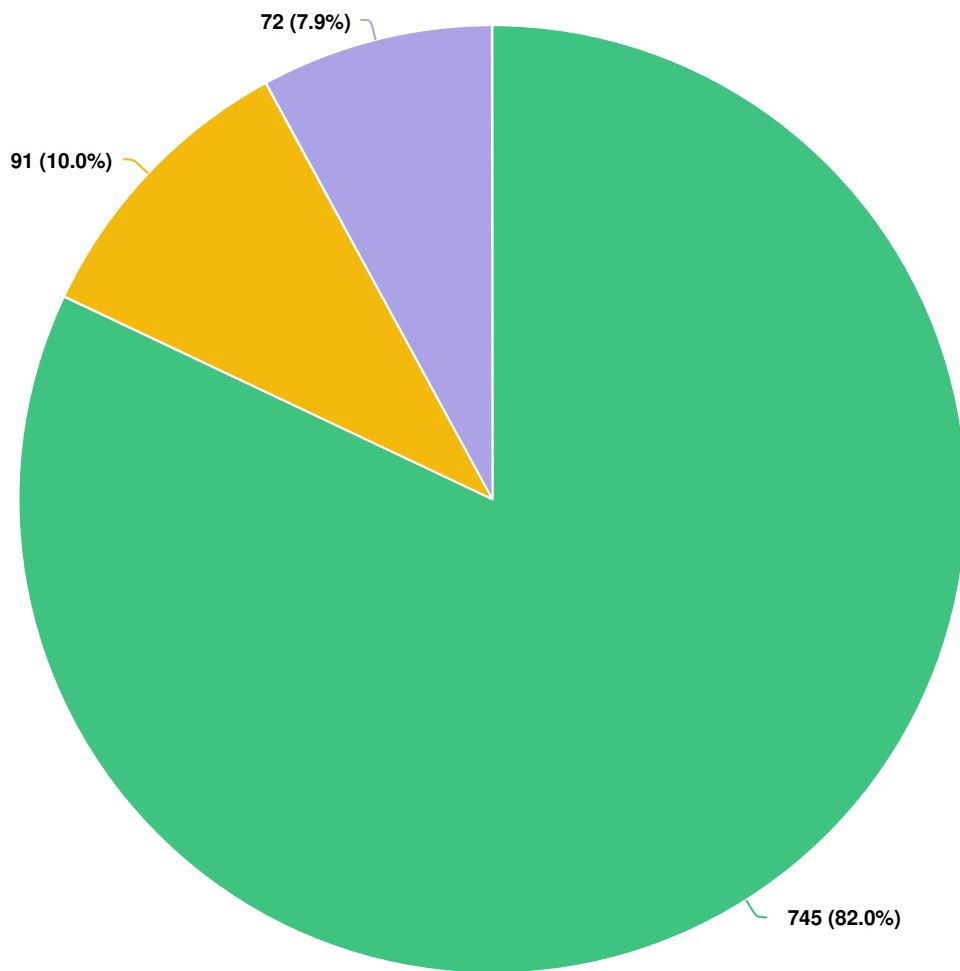

Snow clearing and parking

City crews often cannot clear snow on residential streets due to the number of on-street obstacles (vehicles, trailers, sports equipment, etc.). The following strategies are in use in other municipalities. Please indicate your level of support for each strategy for use in Whitehorse.

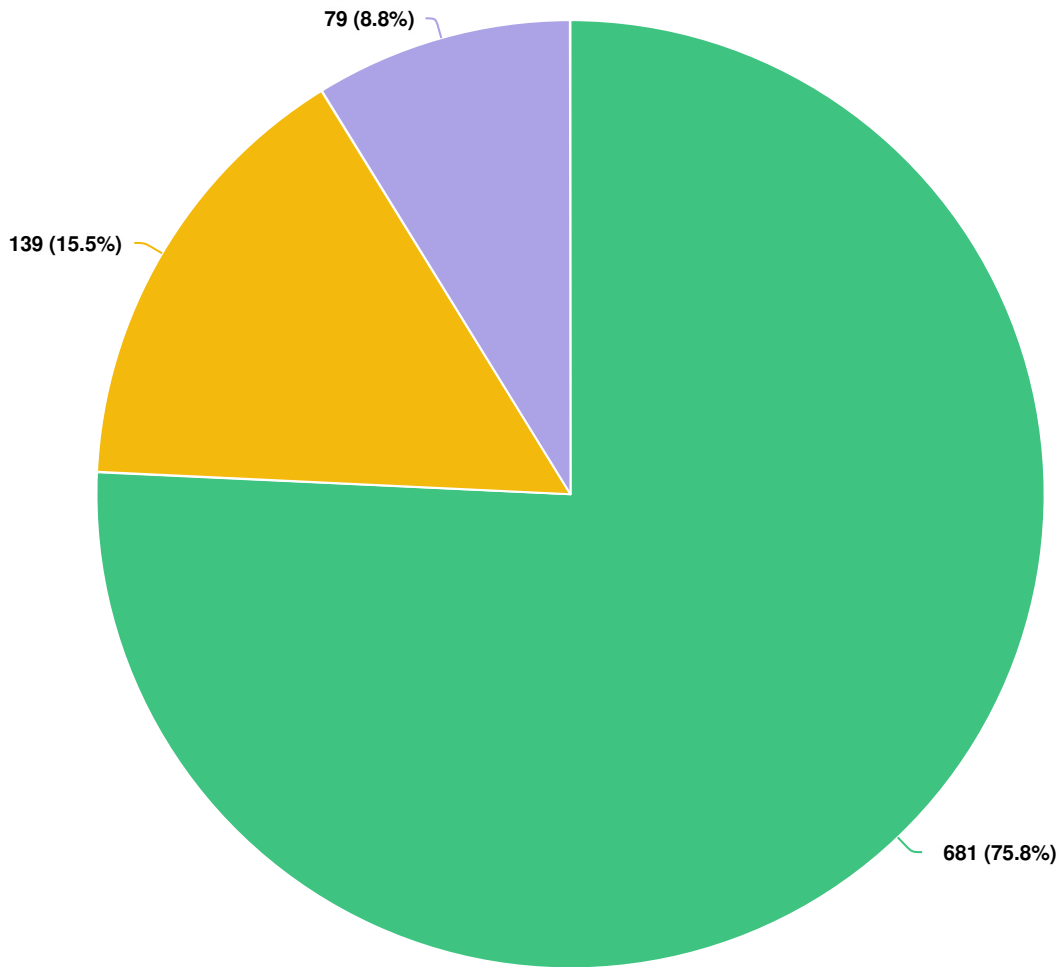

The City provides advance notice that snow clearing will occur. On-street obstacles in the work area are ticketed and towed to a secure lot.



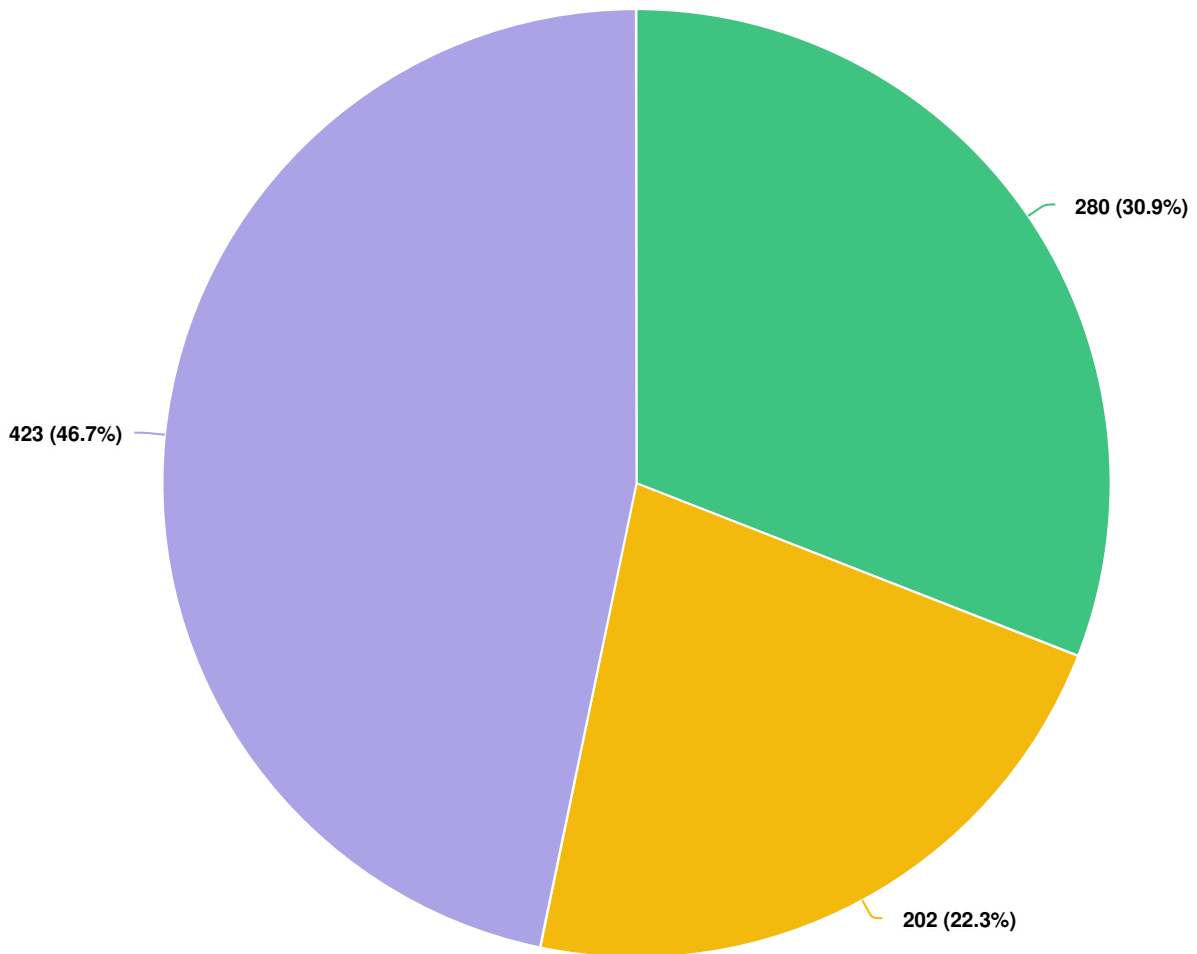

On-street parking is prohibited for 2-week periods when snow removal is planned. Any on-street obstacles are ticketed and towed.

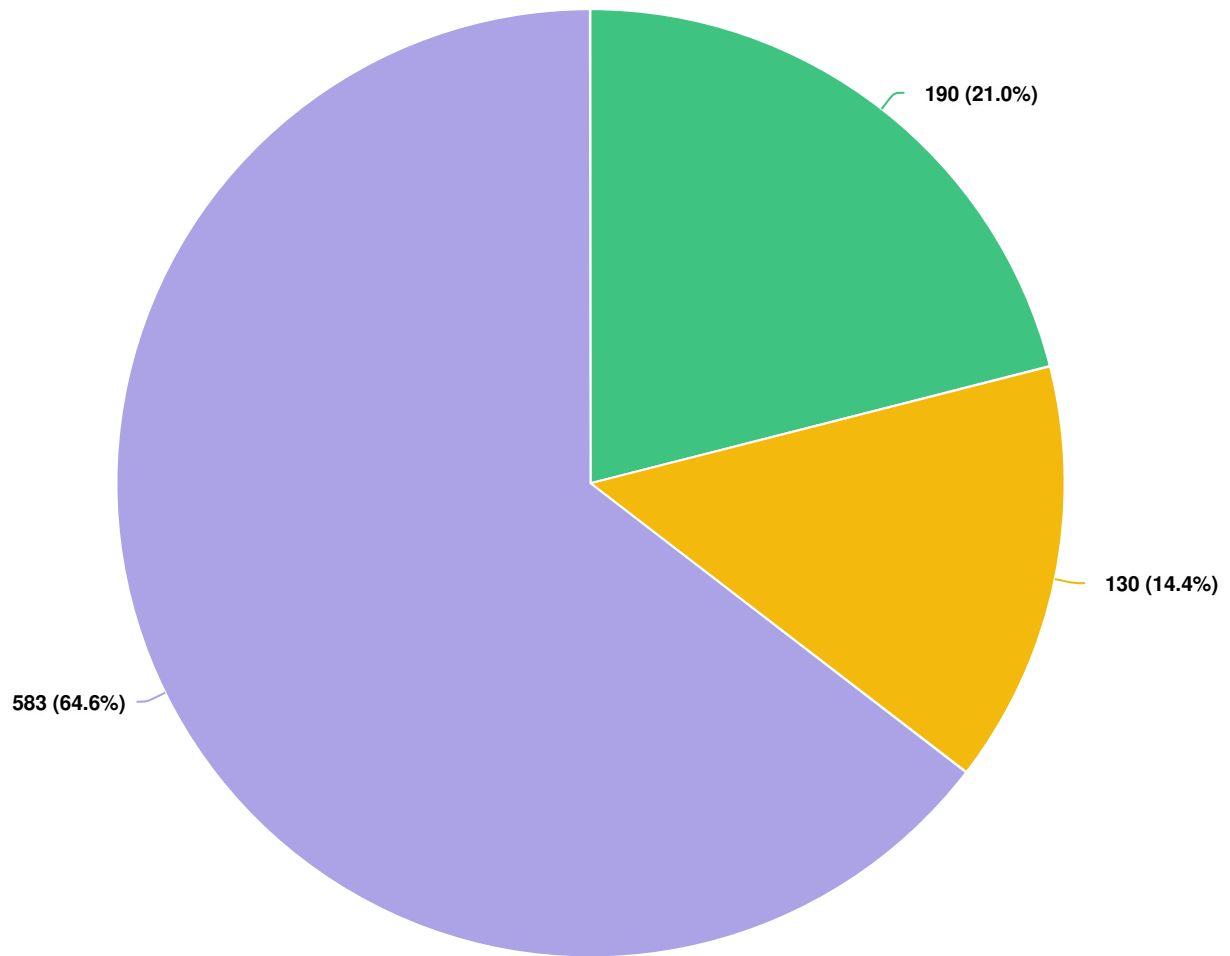
