




What is your main mode of transportation during the winter?




If you use active transportation during the winter months, what route do you choose?











Snow clearing and parking
City crews often cannot clear snow on residential streets due to the number of on-street obstacles (vehicles, trailers, sports equipment, etc.). The following strategies are in use in other municipalities. Please indicate your level of support for each strategy for use in Whitehorse.

The City provides advance notice that snow clearing will occur. On-street obstacles in the work area are towed to a nearby location for owners to pick up. This is free of charge on the first offence, but cars will be ticketed if they need to be towed again.






The City provides advance notice that snow clearing will occur. On-street obstacles in the work area are ticketed and towed to a secure lot.




