#### **PUBLIC INPUT SESSION**

Mayor Cameron advised that a Public Input Session was scheduled at this meeting to hear any submissions with respect to the 2025-2027 Operating Budget Bylaw.

2025-2027 Operating Budget Bylaw

Keitha Clark, representing the Yukon Anti-Poverty Coalition, raised concerns about the administration of the free transit program. The delegate emphasized the need for equitable transit access, noting that organizations distributing passes

Keitha Clark, Yukon Anti-Poverty Coalition had run out. The delegate urged council to clarify the city's position on accepting external funding for transit support and to explore federal funding opportunities before increasing fares.

Julie Frish spoke against the proposed increase in Whitehorse transit fares. The delegate underscored the impact of higher fares on seniors, who rely on transit for medical appointments, social connections, and daily needs. The delegate questioned whether the fare hike would lead to more frequent and reliable bus service, emphasizing that without improvements, ridership could decline. The delegate called for a review of past transit studies and urged council to explore federal funding options before approving the increase.

Leander Slykhuis raised concerns about the property tax increase, citing disparities in tax rates between older and newer neighborhoods. The delegate compared two properties—one in Logan and one in Porter Creek—highlighting significant tax differences despite similar access to municipal services. The delegate urged council to address inconsistencies in property tax assessments and ensure equitable tax distribution.

Leander Slykhuis

Mike McCormack, questioned the sustainability of the city's budget growth, noting that operational expenses had increased while population growth lagged behind. The delegate pointed to rising property taxes, utility fees, and service charges as signs of excessive spending. McCormack advocated for a "return to basics," prioritizing infrastructure maintenance, core services, and fiscal restraint.

Kristina Zahar spoke against the tax increase, citing its impact on low-income tenants. The delegate described financial struggles associated with operating a housing complex, where rising costs and limited municipal incentives made it difficult to keep rents affordable.

#### **City Operations Committee**

Council inquired about the Spring 2025 planning in respect to any Robert Service Way closures. Administration confirmed closures will be risk-based, not routine, with ongoing monitoring to maintain access. The importance of public communication was emphasized, and Administration noted that long-term stabilization planning is in early feasibility, requiring a multi-year approach and secured funding. It was confirmed that decisions are guided by expert risk assessments and that technical briefings are planned for Council.

New Business – Robert Service Way Closure

Delegate Keitha Clark, representing the Yukon Anti-Poverty Coalition spoke on the importance of free transit, arguing it is a government responsibility. The delegate raised concerns over unclear pass distribution, funding gaps, and the proposed fare increase, and urged the City to expand pickup locations and work with the Yukon government to work out long-term solutions.

Keitha Clark, Yukon Anti-Poverty Coalition – Public Transit Delegate Jane Robinson-Boivin of the Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre spoke to Council on the importance of extending transit hours for community safety, emphasizing its impact on women and gender-diverse individuals facing unsafe transportation options. The delegate highlighted examples of similar-sized cities with later transit service and called on the City to explore extending evening and early morning service.

Jane Robinson-Boivin, Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre-

Delegate Robin Reid-Fraser of Climate Action Yukon spoke to Council on the importance of expanding both transit and fare-free public transit, emphasizing the role transit plays in reducing greenhouse gas emissions, improving accessibility, and enhancing city liveability. The delegate highlighted the financial and environmental costs of car dependency and urged the City to invest in the transit system as a key climate action measure.

Robin Reid-Fraser, Climate Action Yukon – Public Transit

Delegate Audrey Provan spoke to Council on the need for improved transit access for youth, emphasizing barriers created by service hours, and ridership costs. The delegate highlighted the impact transit has on students' ability to access school, work, and extracurricular activities and urged the City to make transit free, increase service frequency, extend hours, and consult youth in future transit planning.

Audrey Provan – Public Transit

Delegates Forest Pearson of the Whitehorse Urban Cycling Coalition, and Colin McCann of the Klondike Snowmachine Association spoke on the Hamilton Boulevard trail pilot project, emphasizing the need for collaboration between the City, the Whitehorse Urban Cycling Coalition, and the Klondike Snowmobile Association. Both proposed delaying the pilot until fall to preserve the current snow base for all users and urged the City to establish a feedback process during the pilot for ongoing improvements.

Forest Pearson, Whitehorse Urban Cycling Coalition, and Colin McCann, Klondike Snowmachine Association – Hamilton Boulevard Trail Winter Maintenance

#### 1. Public Input Report – 2025-2027 Operating Budget

Administration presented a summary of the Public Input Session that was held January 27, 2025, regarding the proposed 2025-2027 Operating Budget bylaw. Twenty-three written submissions were received, and five members of the public spoke at the Public Input Session. The report responded to concerns raised on transit and transportation, downtown revitalization and the town square, snow and ice control, and infrastructure investment. Administration provided additional information on transit operation costs, the proposed fare increase, and the Yukon Government's free transit pass program.

#### The Recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council direct that Bylaw 2025-01, a bylaw to adopt the 2025 Operating Budget and the 2026 and 2027 Provisional Budgets, be brought forward for Second and Third Readings under the bylaw process; and

THAT the associated 2025 Tax Levy Bylaw 2025-02, and Fees and Charges Amendment Bylaw 2025-03 be brought forward for Second and Third Readings under the bylaw process.

#### 2. <u>Upcoming Procurements (March/April) – For Information Only</u>

As outlined in the Procurement Policy, the Committee was presented with a bi-monthly update on forthcoming procurements projects with an anticipated value greater than \$100,000 for the period of March and April 2025. Administration provided additional information on specific line items such as new and replacement vehicles, emergency shelter washrooms, and the Whitehorse Operations Building biomass heating project.

#### 3. <u>2025 Negotiating Team Terms of Reference</u>

The International Association of Fire-Fighters (IAFF) Local 2217 has served the City with a Notice to Bargain regarding the Collective Agreement between the City and the IAFF. In order for negotiating teams to proceed, Council must confirm the Terms of Reference that establish authority, powers, and duties of the negotiation team. Administration presented the proposed Terms of Reference and provided the term lengths of previous Collective Agreements with the IAFF.

#### The Recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council endorse the 2025 Negotiating Team Terms of Reference.

#### 4. Budget Amendment – Whistle Bend Active Transportation Connector

A budget amendment was presented to add the Whistle Bend Active Transportation Connector project to the 2026 Provisional Capital Budget. A detailed funding strategy will be presented as part of the next capital budget cycle, but as of now, the project is expected to cost a total of \$12,500,000, with 75% being funded through the new Active Transportation Fund from the Government of Canada. Administration responded to questions on the new federal fund, possible routes and maintenance costs, and the public consultation process.

#### The Recommendation of the Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council direct that Bylaw 2025-17, a bylaw to amend the 2025-2028 Capital Expenditure Program by adding project 240c00225, Whistle Bend Active Transportation Connector in the amount of \$12,500,000 to the 2026 Provisional Capital Budget, be brought forward for consideration under the bylaw process.

### 1. <u>Supplemental Information Report – Northeast Casca Boulevard</u> Amendments

A report was presented providing additional information on proposed Bylaw 2024-49, a bylaw to amend 401 Casca Boulevard and an area northeast of Casca Boulevard. The report covered mitigation measures and strategies, the land use master plan policy, and split zoning. Administration responded to questions on trail access and the absence of a standard trail setback, the impact of density on surrounding greenspace, and the process for master planning, including Council's role in process, and future public input before development.



- 2. The zoning maps attached to and forming part of Zoning Bylaw 2012-20 are hereby amended by changing the zoning of 100 Robert Service Way from PS Public Service to PSx(e) Public Service (Modified) as indicated on Appendix A attached hereto and forming part of this bylaw.

#### CITY OF WHITEHORSE BYLAW 2025-11

A bylaw to amend Traffic Bylaw 2013-34.

WHEREAS section 220 of the *Municipal Act* provides that the power to adopt a bylaw or pass a resolution includes the power to amend or repeal the bylaw or resolution unless the Act or any other Act expressly provides otherwise; and

WHEREAS Section 125 of the *Motor Vehicles Act* provides that a municipality may authorize the placing, erecting, or marking of traffic control devices at any locations considered necessary for controlling highways subject to its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS section 126(1) of the MVA provides that a municipality may, with respect to highways subject to its jurisdiction, make bylaws not inconsistent with this Act and on matters for which no provision is made in this Act, for the regulation and control of vehicle, animal, and pedestrian traffic, the specifics of which are set forth in subsections (a) through (m); and

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable that the Traffic Bylaw is amended for the provision of transit priority lanes;

NOW THEREFORE the council of the municipality of the City of Whitehorse, in open meeting assembled, hereby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Section 2 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended by adding two new definitions as follows:
  - a. "SCHOOL BUS" means a Vehicle used for transporting children to and from school and on activities connected with school.
  - b. "STOP" means stopping of a Vehicle as defined in the Yukon *Motor Vehicles Act*.

Section 2 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended by amending the existing definitions for "BUS LANE" and "BUS ZONE" as follows:

- c. "TRANSIT LANE" means a reserved and marked portion of a Roadway surface, on which only transit Vehicles and other permitted Vehicles are allowed to travel.
- d. "TRANSIT ZONE" means a portion of a Highway, including on public property or private property and shall include those situated on private property at Yukon University or Whitehorse General Hospital, which has been designated for use by City of Whitehorse Transit Services and are identified by sign or symbol as a space reserved for use exclusively by City of Whitehorse Transit Services unless otherwise specified within this bylaw.

#### Traffic Bylaw Amendment Bylaw 2025-11

- 2. Section 60 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "60. No Person other than a driver of a transit Vehicle that is actively engaged in the Loading or Unloading of passengers shall Park or Stop a Vehicle on a portion of a Highway designated by a sign as a Transit Zone."
- 3. Section 61 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "61. No Person other than a driver of a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle shall Park or Stop a Vehicle on a portion of a Highway designated by a sign as a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Zone."
- 4. Section 62 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "62. No Person other than a driver of a tour bus shall Park or Stop a Vehicle on a portion of a Highway designated by a sign as a tour bus zone."
- 5. Section 63 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "63. No Person other than a driver of a Vehicle for Hire shall Park or Stop a Vehicle on a portion of a Highway designated by a sign as a Taxi Stand."
- 6. Section 64 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "64. During those hours not included in City of Whitehorse Transit Services' scheduled hours of service, drivers of Vehicles for Hire and charter buses may use the Transit Zones for the routing functions of waiting for, picking up and discharging fares."
- 7. Section 65 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "65. A driver of a Vehicle in the Lane of traffic directly adjacent to a Transit Zone shall yield the right of way to a driver of a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle if:
    - (1) the City of Whitehorse Transit Services driver has engaged the turn signal of the City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle to indicate intention to drive into the adjacent Lane; and
    - (2) it is practical and safe for the driver of the Vehicle to yield the right of way to the City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle."
- 8. Section 66 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "66. A driver of a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle shall not reenter a Lane of traffic or move into the path of an oncoming Vehicle unless:
    - (1) the City of Whitehorse Transit Services driver has engaged the turn signal of the City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle; and
    - (2) it is practical and safe for the driver of the oncoming Vehicle to yield the right of way to the City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle."

#### Traffic Bylaw Amendment Bylaw 2025-11

- 9. Section 67 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "67. A driver of a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle shall not engage the turn signal of the Vehicle until the driver is ready to re-enter traffic in the adjacent Lane."
- 10. Section 68 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "68. No Person other than a driver of a City of Whitehorse Transit Services Vehicle or School Bus is to drive in a Transit Lane unless specifically signed otherwise or given permission by the City."
- 11. Section 69 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "69. Cyclists are permitted to ride in the Lewes Boulevard Transit Lane between Alsek Road and Hospital Road, having the same rights and duties as drivers of a motor Vehicle as prescribed in the *Motor Vehicles* Act of the Yukon Territory and the City Traffic Bylaw."
- 12. Section 70 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "70. A Vehicle may:
    - (1) cross a Transit Lane to enter or exit from adjacent driveways or intersecting streets; or
    - (2) to enter or exit from existing parking structures or parking lots adjacent to a Transit Lane."
- 13. Section 71 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "71. An emergency Vehicle or a Vehicle operated by the City for City purposes may be operated, Stopped or Parked in a Transit Lane."
- 14. Section 72 of Bylaw 2013-34 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "72. The Manager of Engineering may issue a Permit authorizing a Vehicle to be operated, Stopped or Parked in any portion of a Transit Lane.

This bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon final passage thereof.





  - (1) by resolution of council to a maximum expenditure of \$500,000.00; or
  - (2) by bylaw for expenditures in excess of \$500,000.00.
- 3. Expenditures authorized in accordance with sections 2(1) and 2(2) of this bylaw that result in an increase in total expenditures above what was approved in the 2025 operating budget shall be brought forward for final approval through an umbrella bylaw at year end.
- 4. The Director of Corporate Services is hereby authorized to re-allocate funds within the line items in Appendix "A" to a maximum expenditure of \$100,000.00.
- 5. The Director of Corporate Services and City Manager may jointly re-allocate funds between the line items in Appendix "A" to a maximum expenditure of \$100,000.00.
- 6. This bylaw shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on January 1, 2025.

A bylaw to levy property taxes for the year 2025

WHEREAS section 55(2) of the *Assessment and Taxation Act* requires that each municipality shall levy taxes upon all taxable real property within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS section 55(3) of the *Assessment and Taxation Act* provides for the establishment of different classes of real property, and varied tax rates according to the class of real property to be taxed;

NOW THEREFORE the council of the municipality of the City of Whitehorse, in open meeting assembled, hereby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this bylaw,
  - "Agricultural" means all property used primarily for agricultural purposes and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as AGR.
  - "Non-Residential" means all property used primarily for commercial, industrial and public purposes and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as CH, CMC, CMH, CML, CR, CMS, INS, MHI, MSI, PI, PRC and QRY.
  - "Residential" means all property used primarily for residential use and designated on the Whitehorse Assessment Roll as OSP, POS, RCM, REC, RMH, RR1, RSA, RSC, RSM, RS1, RS2 and TRA.
- 2. A general tax for the year 2025 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "agricultural" at the rate of 1.193 percent.
- 3. A general tax for the year 2025 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "non-residential" at the rate of 1.675 percent.
- 4. A general tax for the year 2025 shall be levied upon all taxable real property in the City of Whitehorse classified "residential" at the rate of 1.123 percent.
- 5. This bylaw shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on January 1, 2025.
