Free brush disposal for residential FireSmarting

The City is partnering with the Government of Yukon to support Whitehorse residents in FireSmarting their properties.

Residents can now drop off the brush for free at the Waste Management Facility until October 31.

Waste Management Facility hours of operation:

Weekdays: 7:30 am - 5:30 pm **Weekends:** 9 am - 5:30 pm

Be sure to bring your brush seperately, or a mixed load disposal fee will apply. Residents are asked to inform gate attendants that their load is FireSmart brush.

This program is does not apply to commercial brush disposal.
