Administration presented the 2nd quarter operating budget variance and answered questions regarding the implications of staff vacancies, the treatment of salaries through the budget cycle, and transfers to reserves. Administration clarified that vacancies are anticipated through the budget process to avoid additional tax burden and that the current figures are consistent with typical year-to-date results.

City Planning Committee

Delegates Michael Muller, Amy McClintock, and Lisa Wiklund representing the Yukon Energy Corporation presented an update on the Whitehorse Power Centres Project, outlining projected demand growth and the need for new thermal generators by Winter 2027–28. The work was described as being broken into north and south sites, along with a proposed substation at Long Lake Road, with 13 candidate locations identified to be narrowed through criteria related to environment, noise, air quality, and system capacity, together with public and stakeholder engagement. The delegates addressed the Yukon Energy Corporation's understanding of City processes for leasing and rezoning, addressed questions about noise, air quality, and fuel choice, and confirmed that the south site is expected to proceed first due to existing system capacity, with northern upgrades to follow.

Committee members continued discussion on the Whitehorse Power Centres Project. In response to questions, Administration confirmed that 11 sites within City boundaries are subject to master plan requirements unless waivers are granted, with the file proceeding to the Development Review Committee. Administration further explained that rezoning and OCP amendments will follow standard application processes but will be able to run concurrently.

Bylaw 2025-33, a bylaw to amend the zoning of 11 lots between McIntyre Drive and Boyd Crescent, from FN-FP – First Nation Future Planning to FN-CIM – Mixed Use Commercial/Industrial (Modified)

The City received an application to rezone 11 lots between McIntyre Drive and Boyd Crescent from FN-FP – First Nation Future Planning to FN-CIM – Mixed Use Commercial/Industrial (Modified), to enable the development of government buildings.

Explanatory Notes:

The attached bylaw amends the Fees and Charges Bylaw to reflect changes based on the operational review performed in the framework of the Q3 fees and charges review.

The changes include new fees, fee increases, deletion of redundant fees, and amendments to fee descriptions to provide clarity. The changes are highlighted and are detailed as follows:

Schedule 8 (Parks)

- Remove inoperative fees for rental in designated areas for programmed activities and rental of outdoor garbage and recycling compost bins.
- Update description for memorial bench fees to improve clarity.
- Add new rental fees for the exclusive use of a field behind Takhini Arena for dog training activities, effective January 1, 2026.

Schedule 9 (Planning)

 Delete Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws reprinting fees as they are outdated and have not been used for several years.

Schedule 12 (Waste Management)

- Reduce curbside collection fees due to implementation of the Extended Producer Responsibility program for packaging and paper products, effective November 1, 2025.
- Eliminate tipping fees for recyclable materials at the Waste Management Facility (WMF), following the relocation of the residential recycling depot.

Delegates Michael Muller, Amy McClintock, and Lisa Wiklund representing the Yukon Energy Corporation presented an update on the Whitehorse Power Centres Project, outlining projected demand growth and the need for new thermal generators by Winter 2027–28. The work was described as being broken into north and south sites, along with a proposed substation at Long Lake Road, with 13 candidate locations identified to be narrowed through criteria related to environment, noise, air quality, and system capacity, together with public and stakeholder engagement. The delegates addressed the Yukon Energy Corporation's understanding of City processes for leasing and rezoning, addressed questions about noise, air quality, and fuel choice, and confirmed that the south site is expected to proceed first due to existing system capacity, with northern upgrades to follow.
