Chimney Fire Safety

Residents are encouraged to have a qualified professional inspect their wood stove and entire chimney system annually.

Routine maintenance and use of well-seasoned wood provides maximum efficiency, and will reduce air quality concerns and the risk of chimney fire.

Cold ashes should be removed frequently from wood stoves to maintain air circulation around wood.

Removed ashes should be placed directly in a metal receptacle with a tight fitting lid. The receptacle should then be placed outside, away from any combustaibles. After a week, it can be bagged and added to your black bin or saved for the garden.
