### **Zoning Reminders**

A friendly reminder for home owners to become familiar with and follow zoning regulations for their properties.

Common issues that come up around residential zoning:

**Fences:** can be up to 1.2 m in front yards and 2 m in rear and side yards.

**Driveways:** requirements are based on the size of your property.

**Exterior Lighting:** must be capped, directed downward and not shine into neighbouring properties.

**Curbside Collection Carts:** may not be stored within front yard setbacks or exterior (streetfacing) side yard setbacks.

### **Residential Recycling Update**

Effective November 1, the Yukon's Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program for residential recycling begins. The City's temporary recycling depot at the Waste Management Facility will be closed. Curbside recycling collection will continue on the same schedule, but residents will no longer be charged \$12.50/month for the service. More details about the EPR program will be released before November 1.

#### **Proposed Zoning Bylaw**

City Council is reviewing a proposed new Zoning Bylaw. A Zoning Bylaw governs what kind of development can occur and how property and land can be used within the city. ### **Senior Utility Rebate**

Applications for the 2025 Senior Utility Rebate are now open. The rebate is available to Whitehorse residents aged 65 and older, or to eligible surviving spouses. The rebate is for fees paid for City water, sewer and garbage services to a maximum of \$500 per year. Visit whitehorse.ca/SUR to sign up.
