In Focus

Snow and Ice Control

As winter begins to settle in, the City is reminding residents that snow clearing is everyone's responsibility.

Residential Properties:

- sidewalks and lane crossing must be clear within 48 hours of a snowfall.
- any snow cleared must stay on the property and cannot be placed on the roadway.

Commercial Properties:

- sidewalks, lane crossings, ramps, and accessible parking spots must be cleared by 11 a.m. the day after a snowfall.
- any snow cleared must stay on the property or disposed of at the City's snow dump.

Residential Recycling Changes

On November 1st, a new, free public residential recycling depot opens at Raven ReCentre. The City's temporary recycling depot at the Waste Management Facility will be closed after October 31. Whitehorse Blue Bin Recycling will continue to provide curbside recycling in Whitehorse according to the existing schedule, but residents will no longer be charged for the service as of November 1st.
