Heritage Incentive

Property owners of eligible heritage buildings are invited to apply for funding under the City's Heritage Incentive Policy. The incentive provides funding for up to 50 per cent, to a maximum of \$20,000, for conservation work on designated Municipal Historic Sites. Application deadline is Wednesday, April 1. Community Safety and Well-being Plan

The City and Yukon government are developing a Community Safety and Well-being Plan for Whitehorse. The plan will focus on improving safety and well-being for residents. A survey is being conducted by the Canadian Centre for Safer Communities that will help determine local safety concerns, identify key priorities, and shape future initiatives as the plan is developed.
