1. **Proclamation – National Indigenous Peoples’ Day (June 21, 2026)**

Deputy Mayor Anne Middler proclaimed June 21, 2026 to be National Indigenous Peoples’ Day in the city of Whitehorse, a day to recognize the valued contributions of Indigenous Peoples to Whitehorse’s past, present and future, and the continued efforts of all parties to work together in pursuit of meaningful reconciliation.

2. **Delegate Barbara Hancock, President of Humane Society Yukon – Presentation on Humane Society Yukon**

Delegate Barbara Hancock, President of Humane Society Yukon, provided an overview of the organization, including increasing animal intake, shelter capacity pressures, and financial challenges. The delegate also highlighted opportunities for collaboration with the City. Committee Members asked questions regarding owner surrenders, funding sources, and the relationship between the City and Humane Society Yukon.

3. New Business – Active Commute Feedback

As requested by a Committee Member, Administration advised that feedback from 2026 Active Transportation Month is still being compiled and that feedback related to infrastructure will be considered as part of future engineering projects.

4. New Business –Relationship with Humane Society Yukon

As requested by a Committee Member, Administration advised that the City is working to strengthen its relationship with Humane Society Yukon, including through ongoing engagement related to animal control matters.

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Your Worship, the Public Health and Safety Committee respectfully submits the following report:

1. Delegate Colin McCann – Cycling Association of Yukon – Cycling Safety

Delegate Colin McCann, speaking on behalf of the Cycling Association of Yukon, discussed concerns regarding cyclist safety and increasing hostility toward cyclists in Whitehorse. The delegate emphasized the need for improved cycling infrastructure and, in response to questions from Committee Members, discussed the Association's membership and opportunities to improve safety at future cycling events.

2. Delegate Ed Gillis – Safe Cycling Infrastructure

Delegate Ed Gillis discussed the importance of safe cycling infrastructure and active transportation, particularly for youth. The delegate highlighted the benefits of cycling for education, recreation, and tourism and, in response to questions from Committee Members, shared observations on opportunities to improve cyclist safety.

3. Delegate Dana Eisinger – Cycling Safety and Respectful Road Use

Delegate Dana Eisinger discussed concerns regarding increasing hostility toward cyclists and the impact it has on cyclist safety and participation. The delegate highlighted the efforts of local cycling organizations to promote safe and responsible cycling and encouraged continued collaboration, public education, and partnership to improve safety for all road users.

4. Delegate Joel Macht – Active Transportation and Road Safety

Delegate Joel Macht discussed the role of community feedback in transportation planning and the importance of understanding the experiences of vulnerable road users. The delegate encouraged City representatives and community members to experience active transportation firsthand as a means of fostering discussion and improving road safety for all users.

5. New Business – Encampment Update

As requested by a Committee Member, Administration provided an update on the encampment located along the river near 32 Waterfront Place. Administration advised that work is underway with partner agencies to address the site.

6. New Business – Titanium Way Criterium Series Safety

As requested by a Committee Member, Administration provided an update on the Titanium Way Criterium Series, advising that organizers had identified lessons learned from the event and that a debrief meeting with the user groups is being arranged.

1. Audited 2025 Financial Statements

Administration presented the 2025 Audited Financial Statements as required under the Municipal Act. Committee Members discussed the audit process, reserve balances, utility operations, and municipal financial reporting, with Administration providing additional information and clarification.

The Recommendation of Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council approve the audited City of Whitehorse 2025 Financial Statements as presented, and

THAT \$614,450 be transferred from the Water and Sewer Reserve to fund the Water and Sewer Fund deficit.

2. Upcoming Procurements (July/August) – For Information Only

In accordance with the Procurement Policy, the Committee was presented with a bi-monthly update on forthcoming procurement projects for July and August with an anticipated value greater than \$100,000. As requested by a Committee Member, Administration confirmed that funding allocated for the Downtown Parking Management Plan would be used for technical consulting services, stakeholder engagement, data collection, and policy and infrastructure review.

3. Budget Amendment – Millenium Trail Erosion

A budget amendment is required to add funding for the Millennium Trail Realignment project following erosion along the riverbank. As requested by a Committee Member, Administration discussed whether a YESAB review may be required and provided information on emergency work already completed under the authority of the City Manager's Bylaw.

The Recommendation of Corporate Services Committee is

THAT Council amend the 2026–2029 Capital Expenditure Program by adding a project for Millenium Trail Realignment in the amount of \$150,000 funded from the Capital Reserve until an external funding source is secured.

4. New Business - Federation of Canadian Municipalities Conference Report

A Committee member provided a report from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Conference in Edmonton, Alberta, attended by Councillors Gallina, Melnychuk, and Morris. The Committee Members highlighted the importance of attendance at this Conference to bring northern perspectives and priorities into discussions with other municipalities.


1. New Business – Climate Action Plan Update
