Millennium Trail closure

A section of the Millennium Trail in Riverdale is closed due to erosion. Residents are asked to follow signage and stay off the closed section of the trail. Planning is underway to permanently realign the trail. The City will continue to provide updates as the work progresses. Turn Off Frost Protection

Fourth Avenue Asphalt Work

Asphalt overlay work on Fourth Avenue between Ogilvie Street and Second Avenue is underway and will continue throughout June. Traffic disruptions can be expected.
