Responsible Dog Ownership

Even the most obedient dogs can act unpredictably. A leash is your best tool for having safety and harmony in public spaces. Make sure your dog is under control and take steps to avoid conflicts with other dogs. Dog waste should be bagged and placed in the garbage, never in the compost. The City has dog waste bag containers throughout Whitehorse, and you can find the location map, info about licensing, and our Animal Control Bylaw by visiting whitehorse.ca/animals.

FireSmart Brush

The City and Government of Yukon are partnering to support residents in FireSmarting their properties. Drop off brush for free at the Waste Management Facility until Saturday, October 31. The facility is 3.5 km north of the Two Mile Hill Road and Alaska Highway intersection. Bring your brush separately, or a mixed load disposal fee will apply.
